As the four governments of our Nation introduce new measures of lockdown rather then have one set of policies for the UK, they have made it more confusing for the general public, we each have a responsibility to keep ourselves and others

Bishop Larry Duffy the Bishop of the Diocese of Clogher has put it far more elegantly then I would have when he said "The restrictions call us to personal responsibility; to comply with public health and hygiene requirements and to look out for the needs of others. So many are doing that on the frontline and in our schools and public services. In fighting this contagious virus, all of us need to do the same in whatever walk of life we are in.

"As Christians we are all especially called to serve each other, to be Christ to each other in every situation. Saint Teresa of Ávila, whose feast we celebrate today, puts its well:

'Christ has no body now but yours. No hands, no feet on earth but yours. Yours are the eyes through which he looks compassion on this world. Yours are the feet with which he walks to do good. Yours are the hands through which he blesses all the world. Yours are the hands, yours are the feet, yours are the eyes, you are his body.'

Please Brothers remember to stay in regular contact (once or twice a week) with all of our Brothers, Widows and Clergy, I thank those who have been doing this, if you have not I ask that you start to make the calls. No one should be forgotten.

"Fratelli tutti" (All Brothers)

In His holiness Pope Francis new Encyclical he encourages us to practice to fraternity and social friendship. This 98-page document it inspires us to love one another a God loves us.

Opened by a brief introduction and divided into eight chapters, the Encyclical gathers – as the Pope himself explains – many of his statements on fraternity and social friendship, arranged, however, "in a broader context of reflection" and complemented by "a number of letters, documents" sent to Francis by "many individuals and groups throughout the world"

'Fraternity is to be encouraged not only in words, but in deeds. Deeds made tangible in a "better kind of politics", which is not subordinated to financial interests, but to serving the common good, able to place the dignity of every human being at the centre and assure work to everyone'

Zoom!

Earlier this year the Media Committee looked a various different pieces of video-conferencing software when it became apparent that the Board of Directors would not be able to travel and meet face-to-face.

We looked at Skype, IMO, WhatsApp Video, Microsoft Teams and Zoom. We found that Zoom was the best platform for us as a Board of Directors.

As time went on during the pandemic we looked at whether this was possible to scale up for the Order and found that it was.

When the decision was made at the recent Board of Directors Annual Reports with the Provincial Grand Knights that face-to-face Meetings were postponed once again we contacted Zoom to find out the cost of procuring 25 Zoom licenses, one for each Province, as well as 2 more for use by the Board and the Supreme Knight.

After striking a deal the hard work started! We had to ensure that Provinces and Councils knew how to Zoom. So last month we held a Zoom training Seminar every evening and 3 more at the weekends to ensure that we covered all the Provinces.

If you Province has not contacted you about joining your Zoom Training Seminar then please do email your Provincial Grand Knight and cc media@ksc.org.uk into that email. We would like to know who wants to be able to use this facility and who doesn't! (Everyone should)

As such from 1st November 2020 all Council and Provincial Meetings will now be held on Zoom.

We are (at time of writing) adding a new "How to Zoom!" section to the Members Area. This will show you step-by-step how to arrange and schedule Meetings, How to send out invites and what can be done once your Meeting has started.

In mid-November we will back this up with a PDF guide on How to Zoom! which will be emails to all PGKs and GKs.
