## GOVERNANCE

Dear Brothers,

It is a principle of KSC democracy that any voting for PGK, GK or associated Officers must be by secret ballot.

To this end, the Supreme Knight and Board of Directors at their Meeting on Saturday 5<sup>th</sup> December, have ruled that any required vote must be deferred until physical meetings can again take place, and ballots be conducted in a traditional manner.

Where there is more than one nomination for any post, the present incumbent must retain their office until their successor can be chosen.

Where there is a single uncontested nomination, the continuation or transition may be effected as normal. This <u>must</u> be communicated in the first instance to PGK's who will inform Supreme Knight via Head Office.

The installation of any Officers and GKs can be carried out by PGK's on Zoom. Full Knighthood and initiations can take place via video conference, but when restrictions are lifted full Knighthood ceremonies will take place during Holy Mass as per normal.

**My comments for December 2020 follows**: Can I respectfully ask you to action the below and give me a feedback? Yes, I appreciate some of the below are Covid-19 permitting.

- 1. With permission can we ask the Parish Priest to present the Parish winners at Mass in front of the Congregation?
- Remember Brothers, not all our young people attend Catholic school and should not be denied participation, there promote these items in the parish.
- 3. Can we announce these competitions from the Lectern at Masses once a year minimum, subject to the support of the Parish Priest? If agreed, we would need to have details to hand out.
- 4. Can we obtain permission from the Parish Priest/Religious/ Catechists to introduce these competitions to our young people during their Holy Communion Course?
- 5. Can we obtain permission from the Parish Priest/Religious/ Catechists to introduce these competitions to our young people during their Confirmation Course?
- 6. Can we scan our winners 1-3, 1-4 or Both year/age group winners entries at Council Level, scan by Council at Provincial Level scan by Provinces back to the Province of Councils whether Paintings, Essay or Prayer entries to all the Participating bodies i.e. Schools, Youth Clubs, Parish Priests etc? Do not display the names of the winners rather use e.g. First Place, Second Place, Third Place and so on....

<u>Faith</u> – Let us keep our Young People involved in all our faith inspired youth competitions and seminars. <u>Family</u> – Involve your children/ grandchildren, extended family and friends in our youth comps.

<u>Fraternity</u> – Let us be true to each other and show our fraternal love for one another in helping each other in carrying out our Youth work.
