Brothers where are the months going?

February was another busy month for me. I had the great pleasure to attend the 100th Anniversary Mass of Council 22 at St. Patrick's in Anderston Glasgow on Friday the 18th of February. Congratulations to the Grand Knight Brother Dom Shannon and all the Brothers for a wonderful reception and Mass.

When you have organised one event you may as well add others. Whilst at the Mass the Brothers from Province 1 and 16 decided to hold a joint Initiation and Elevation Ceremony as well. What a site to behold - 11 new Brothers from Province 1 and 3 from Province 16! Congratulations Brothers and welcome to our great Order. I then had the great honour to Elevate 11 Brothers to Full Knighthood; a fantastic occasion. The Church was full. If that wasn't enough, I had the Honour of presenting Canon Paul Gargaro with his Member of Honour Certificate.

I would like to thank everyone for such a warm welcome and to everyone who had any part in organising this great occasion. As always, a great big thank you to the Ladies who put on such a splendid buffet.

What a month we had! I am sure Brother Danny will put in his report how many new Brothers we have had but congratulations and welcome to all new Brothers from Berwick-upon-Tweed to Province 12 in Southwark. I hope you have a long and enjoyable life as a Knight of St. Columba.

What an inspirational day we had on the 26th of February. I was invited to represent the Order at the Installation of the new Archbishop of Glasgow Bishop William Nolan. What an honour and the Knights of St. Columba were asked to steward. Thanks to the Brothers who so willingly gave up their time. What an honour for me to be led from the back of the Church to the very front row and then presented to the Archbishop. I have assured the Archbishop of our continued support, loyalty and prayers. Unfortunately, we didn't have time to partake of refreshments as we had to rush to catch our connection to Berwick-upon-Tweed.

There have been some changes in Head Office please be patient with us at the moment whilst we get used to the changes.

Could I please say Brothers, I am receiving Council and Provincial Bulletins that range from 19 pages to 23 pages with more colour and pictures in them. What I would suggest, as used to happen in the past, the Grand Knight prints out one copy and passes to the relevant Officer. If you have to print off copies for sick or older Brothers and the cost becomes too much, then submit an expenses claim to your Council.

As we went into March, we had the devasting news that Russia has invaded the Ukraine.

The Knights of Columbus have Brothers working on the frontline providing food shelter and medical supplies to the refugees. They started raising funds and their Supreme Knight said that they would match fund up to \$500,000. I sent an e-mail to both him and the Treasurer but, to date, no response.

I sent out an original e-mail to the Board asking if we could take money from our Benevolent Fund. Unfortunately the rules state that we cannot do that. I found that very disappointing and frustrating that we could not help from that area.

I then asked Brother Sean Smith to set up a Just Giving page. We had the same problems that we had with the JFCT in trying to set it up. Sean then organized a GoFundMe page which we were able to set up. Fantastic response and you can see the results in the Apostolate report. Plus, we are donating

£5,000 from the Emergency Disasters Fund.

We have received some large donations at Head Office - a big thank you to Provinces 12 and 21, Council 117, of £1000 each. We have had a legacy From Brother John Starkey Council 247 who left

£500 in his will. Thanks to all the Councils who have donated. There is still time to donate.

The Order had been asked to organise a Rosary for Peace in George Square Glasgow on 25th March to coincide with Pope Francis' Consecration of Ukraine and Russia to the Immaculate Heart of Mary. This will be led by Archbishop Nolan of Glasgow and Bishop John Keenan of Paisley. A big thank you to Brother Charlie McCluskey and Province 1.

We have found another 8 Brothers who have achieved the amazing feat of being in the Order for 70 years. A platinum certificate will be produced and presented to them.

200 club

Brothers you have to be in it to win it! Ask this month's winner - ME. We have 110 Brothers in now. Can we have a big push and try and get it up to the 200?

Supreme Council 2022:

Preparations are going well. We have had two acceptances from Archbishop Cushley from Edinburgh and Bishop Egan from Portsmouth, and two from Jersey.

Supreme Council 2023:

We have had one bid to date from Province 3 and potentially another two from Provinces 1 and 18.

Regional Directors:

I have asked Brother Charlie McCluskey to chair a subcommittee to look at the roles and feasibility of Regional Directors. We should have a report before the July Board Meeting.

With any luck, our Churches will be rammed on Easter Sunday and for the 50 days after as we continue to celebrate the season of Easter. This is the time to get your leaflets out, tap men on the shoulder who you may not have seen at Mass before and ask them if they want to see what the Knights of St Columba are all about. Be visible in your efforts and men will follow, I'm sure of it.

Whether these men join existing Councils or we create a new one solely led by them, that of course remains to be seen but there is still a chance to get bums on seats within the Order. I'm picking on the Polish a bit! We have dozens of Catholic communities across our land; let's see if we can contact the Priests in the various areas, see if we appeal to them and offer our help to them. If one or two join, great, if not, still lend a hand and as said, men will want what we have – fierce friendship, faith and fraternity – and join us!

I have been asked by many Brothers to introduce a Training element to these Bulletins. Each month will have a new module for you.


Chamber Layout

I carried out a little research through the archives and the Chamber layout. It seems to have begun right at the beginning of the Order in 1919. I'm going to sit on the fence with this to be honest! Is there a place for this in a 21st century men-only group which is trying it's best to move forward? I'd say no, but we have it there and we must adhere to it as best we can and respect our forefathers' judgement. This is easy to say when the Order was 40,000 strong as opposed to now where we do struggle to make ourselves attractive and to encourage young men to join us. Does the Chamber put men off joining? I'd go back with 'does the man have enough about him to see through this and direct his interests to his Knights service beyond the Chamber and put his efforts into positive action and charity efforts?' This is the question we must ask ourselves as an Order for those Brothers who are continually absent at Meetings due to where they are supposed to sit and can't see beyond the history of 'what we do and why we do it'. We are an Order - not an Association, League, Union or Group. Let's take it on and embrace it as part of our being in an organised Lay Order.

I would like to congratulate all the Action officers recently elected (or re-elected) and wish you well in your role. Action is the engine room of our great Order.

Here are some important action events coming up soon that I would like you to support and advertise if you can.

- 1 <u>Ukraine emergency appeal</u> We are working with the Knights of Columbus in Poland to fund food, shelter and clothing for those displaced from their homes. The Board of Directors have authorised £5000 from our Emergency Disasters Fund. In addition, we have set up a GoFundMe page. At the time of writing 65 donors have between them raised an extra £6630. Thank you, please give if you can. https://gofund.me/471e163b (Update: it is now 75 Donors gifting a total as at 28/3/2022 of £7070.

Along the way, we will carry the relics of St Columba, St Andrew and St Margaret, invoking their protection over the Church in these isles. Since his death in 574 AD, pilgrims have flocked to Iona to ask for St Columba's Intercession. Clergy, Kings, and Laity alike undertook arduous journeys to take their petitions to the Holy Abbot's relics. Our mission is to make pilgrimage there, invoking the intercession of Scotland's three patrons, St Andrew, St Margaret and St Columba, to pray for a renewal of the faith in our nation. We are already setting up the email addresses and are waiting for Provincial Officers from <u>all Provinces</u> to get in contact to get set up. We are also now adding Council Grand Knights to the system. Is it secure?

This is a question we are sometimes asked. If you are unsure then the following will explain and allay any fears you have:

Our Office365 system has been set up with anti-phishing, anti-malware, and anti-virus protections in place (as much as we can).

Whilst we can provide some security, we cannot guarantee that the system is 100% secure, like any system worldwide.

Where possible phishing emails and malware emails are tracked by the system and, where possible quarantined by the system and not delivered to inboxes.

With regards to personal attacks, this is out of our purview as an organisation. Nothing is 100% guaranteed, in life, and in computers.

If a user receives a spam email, then this is automatically put into their "junk email" folder. It is left entirely to the user to protect their own computers. We cannot do that for them. All we can do is advise all users that they protect themselves.

I have worked in computer systems for over 30 years and as such I have seen major improvements in security of computer systems.

Are we totally safe from attack? No - no-one ever is.

Do we have protections in place? - Yes, as much as we can including anti-phishing, anti-malware, anti-spyware, and encryption.

Does nothing get through? No - hackers have always been one step ahead of the game, however attacks are few and far between in getting through. Personal protection is for the end-user to organise themselves by installing a good anti-virus software. This in theory provides an extra layer of security.

As we have built the system using only @ksc.org.uk email addresses then personal information on the system is kept to a minimum, unless users decide to include personal details when they use the email system. Again, that is a personal choice.

I have looked at, and do on a regular basis, the reports that I receive from Microsoft about our email system, and I can confirm that in the last 6 weeks we have had only 1 email sent to the quarantine, no phishing emails, no emails that contain any recognised malware contained in emails.

I hope that this answers any such queries. However, if Brothers have any further questions, please feel free to ask them to contact me directly by email and I will answer those queries.
