Final Salute


I'm very grateful to my Brother Supreme Director, Sean Mulligan, for his hard work in updating this most important cermony

The Farewell Ceremony. This Ceremony is done in complete Silence. The Grand Knight and Spirituality Officer, start the ceremony by coming to the head (the head is always furthest from the altar) of the coffin, with the Grand Knight to the right (facing the Altar). The Grand Knight and Welfare Officer walk forward, to just below the foot of the coffin, bow to the Altar in unison, turn and bow to the coffin. The Grand Knight will proceed to his position at the foot of the coffin, if room permits leaving approximately 2 foot from the foot of the coffin, facing the coffin, the Welfare Office will take up his position approximately 2 foot from the head of the coffin facing the Grand Knight. The Council Brothers will lead the ceremony, one Brother can act as steward and direct each bench out in turn. As the Council Brothers start the farewell the Provincial Officers and Directors will make their way to the back of the church, to prepare to join the Brothers, the last four Brothers will be the Provincial Welfare Officer and the SD for Welfare followed by the Provincial Grand Knight and the Supreme Knight if in attendance. Brothers will, in pairs stand at the head of the coffin, walk forward Bow to the altar turn bow to the coffin then proceed to the side aisle (they should be alert to the number of Brothers and ensure they go far enough up the side aisle to ensure there is room for the Brothers coming completing the ceremony).




Proceed to the side aisle. Brothers who have made their way to the side aisle must continuously watch the procession and move up if needed to give more room and as the last of the Brothers have been through prepare to move off ensuring there are no large gaps.



From once all Brothers have paid their respects the Grand Knight walks back to the welfare Officer, and again move forward, bow to the Altar turn bow to the coffin and proceed out of the church.

Action & Social

We currently have 124 shareholders. The aim of the scheme is to raise a regular income for the Apostolate Fund, which will be used for charitable projects, whilst creating a bit of fun and giving you a chance of winning your money back and more. Shares cost just £24 each and gets you entered into 12 draws. The winner gets £100, 2nd place is £50 and 3rd & 4th get £25 each.

Charles Ferro Award - We are looking for entries for the Charles Ferro award. If your council or Province have done something outstanding on Action this year please let us have the details ASAP.

NATIONAL ACTION PROJECT – We have 4 months left so please raise and send funds. The Trust fully funds The John Foster Memorial Home in Kamanur Village, Mangalamcombu in the Palani Hills in Southern India. They feed, clothe, educate and nurture 28 destitute boys. Funds are urgently needed. It costs about £10,000 per year to run the home. The new house which will be called "Columba House" and will cost approximately £45,000.00 to clear the site and rebuild. As Trustee Sheila Hargreaves says... "Our boys come from very rural hill villages, living in shacks constructed of bits of corrugated sheets and plastic, with a palm roof, or just sleeping under a banyan tree, where 'barter' is the usual way of life. They do not have experience of money. So, to help them they are each given 1 rupee a week spending money. They can do what they want with it. 1 rupee equates approximately to 1 penny and it will buy 3 wrapped sweets in the shop in Mangalamcombu village which remember is a twenty minute walk away. Some boys spend their rupee each week, some save it for a few weeks and by a chocolate bar, others just save it and when they go back to their village, they take their treasure very proudly back to help their Dad, Grandma or Guardian.

A tube of smarties costs 60p, so if our boys saved their weekly rupee for a whole year, they still would not be able to buy a tube of smarties, they would need to save for another 8 weeks. Can you imagine waiting and saving for 14 months to buy a tube of smarties.

That is why we challenge you to buy a tube of smarties, enjoy the sweets and then fill the container with 20p pieces, £1 coins or a mixture of coins. If 2000 tubes were filled with 20p coins that would be £24,000 the basic shell of the new house could be built.

If filled with £1 coins it would be £54,000. The house could be completely finished and we could purchase the IT Equipment as well. At the moment we have one laptop for 28 boys to share".

Brothers, at Supreme Council 2021 we presented a cheque for £10,000 to the Trustees of the project. But we need to have one last big push to bring in at least the extra £35,000 that is needed.

SW Forms:

Can I ask that the forms used are the current forms only and written clearly to help stop delays and errors occurring. Thank you to those who have already completed this years forms.

SWC1: Please return as soon as possible, ensuring that the form has 2022/23 in the top right corner.

SW3: (Notification of a death) Please complete the form within 48 hours of death occurring, the current form has revised 2021 in the bottom left-hand corner; Every Grand Knight and Welfare Officer should keep one in their folder. If you do not have one, please email me at welfare@ksc.org.uk and I will send you one, electronically.

It saddens me when I read on a form "only just been told" with the date of death some 2 years previous, it makes it obvious that the council has not been making contact with them for some time.

SW4: (application for a grant) Please remember the fuller picture you give on the form, giving circumstances and why a grant is needed the quicker we can deal with it giving help as soon as possible. Having to get back to councils asking for more information only delays us giving the help needed.

SW4a: Application for special needs – this **must be accompanied by an SWC1** or the SWC1 must have been received by Head Office.

Please <u>do not</u> add Golden Jubilarians or those under 21 on the form as these are automatically paid from the benevolent fund.

Living Rosary:

The living Rosary was sent to me by Brother Lesley Crapp and is working in his council in Jersey – he wanted to share it so other Councils/Provinces can join the prayer, by organising their Brothers to say the Rosary.

The Living Rosary can be done by all Brothers, and will help those who are less active, house bound and even bed bound to join and feel included, even families can get involved.

HOW TO PRAY THE KSC LIVNG ROSARY

Each person will join a group and a specific decade and mystery of the Rosary will be assigned to them which they will pray for a calendar month and on the 1st day of the next month they will pray the following decade of the Rosary. You do not have to meet anyone, you can pray individually at any time of the day or night entirely at your own convenience. A complete living rosary is said every day by a group of 20 people, and each member will complete one of their Rosaries each day in their 20th month. In this booklet you will find all the prayers, Mysteries and decades referred to.

When you pray your allocated decade, you start by announcing the decade and reading the short passage assigned to it. Then pray the Our Father, the Hail Mary 10 times, the Glory be to the Father, and the Fatima prayer.

When you are assigned The Annunciation, you will have to say the opening prayers of the Rosary as well: Make the sign of the Cross, The Apostles Creed, the Our Father, 3 Hail Marys (for the increase in Faith, Hope, and Love respectively), and the Glory be to the Father. Then pray the Intention, announce the Mystery and the decade allocated to you, (Joyful and The Annunciation) and continue as above.

When you are assigned the first decade of one of the other Mysteries you will only have to announce the Mystery before your allocated decade.

When you are allocated The Coronation you will have to say the closing prayers: the Hail Holy Queen, the prayer: O God, whose only begotten Son..., and the Prayer to St. Michael.

If you forget to pray your decade one day, please pray it twice the next to complete the Rosaries.



The leader of a Group will allocate the decades, but need not wait until there are 20 people in the group but start straight away regardless of the number. In such cases the leader will have to allocate the additional closing prayers to the person saying the last decade of the incomplete full Rosary each month.

The leader will liaise with the K S C Provincial or Council Chaplain who will designate the intention to be prayed for and this should be reviewed every three months.

<u>May Rosary on line</u>, again my thanks to Brother Stephen Ferris for organising this for us, please look out for the link that will be sent out, and join us in consecrating our Order to our Blessed Mother. Also remember that we read the prayer consecrating our Order to our Blessed Mother in May during our meetings.

State Benefits:

Universal Credit is paid monthly by the government, or twice a month for some in Scotland.

Universal credit replaces these six benefits:

- **Income support**. This is paid to people who are not expected to look for work for example, carers or lone parents with children under the age of five.
- Income-based jobseeker's allowance (JSA). You can get this if you're looking for work and your household is on a low income. It's paid for as long as you show you are trying to find a job. (Note that this is a separate benefit to contribution-based or "new style" jobseeker's allowance.)
- Income-related employment and support allowance (ESA). This is paid if you are sick/disabled, your household is on a low income and you are unable to work, or have limited capacity to work.
 You will need to pass a 'capability for work' assessment.
- **Housing benefit**. Housing benefit is help for those on a low income who struggle to pay their rent and can't be used to help with mortgage costs.



- **Child tax credit**. This is paid to anyone with children aged 16 or under (under 20 if in education or training) and anyone, whether working or not, can apply.
- Working tax credit. This is paid to anyone with children aged 16 or under (under 20 if in education or training) and anyone, whether working or not, can apply.

Information taken from money saving expert website

I have found from working at the foodbank Universal Credit (UC) is littered with problems, one of the main one being delays in benefits, UC being stopped because of change in circumstances like taking a days work or even hospitalisation or someone not actively looking for work every day, causing massive problems, that can take months to sort out

Welfare Officers have over a number of years been asked to get themselves on the DHSS mailing list, so they can keep themselves up to date with the latest benefits, putting them in a better position to help and advise Brothers, they should also have contact numbers for the local Universal Credit Support team, Citizens advice, Turn2us and Help the Aged who have people trained to help people to find the benefits they need.

Inflation is running high, with the cost of living rising far quicker than wages or pensions.

The government recently announced that households in council tax bands A to D will receive £150 towards paying rising energy costs, the council tax payer on 1st April is eligible to receive the rebate. Can I ask Welfare Officers that is they have not had any notification from their local government Council they should contact them and make enquiries about it.

Debt Help and Advice:

<u>CAP: Christians Against Poverty.</u> This is a charity organisation that can help those who are struggling financially with debt or to make ends meet.

A statement from CAP explains their vision better than I can.



Debt and poverty drain hope from people's lives, and we're not okay with that. Since CAP first began, tens of thousands of people have been helped through our free, community-based services, but there is much more to be done.

We're committed to providing practical help and holistic support though local churches, and proclaiming the Gospel every step of the way.

KSC Email System

We are already setting up the email addresses and are waiting for Provincial Officers from <u>all Provinces</u> to get in contact to get set up. We are also now adding Council Grand Knights to the system. If you are a Provincial Officer or Council Grand Knight you will need to contact Brother Sean Smith on 07786 003737 to get yourself set up (this phone number <u>must not be sent to anyone who is not an Officer in the Order</u>). Get in contact as soon as you can.

Remember: After June 2022 the Order will not be emailing any personal email addresses. We will be sending all correspondence to your @ksc.org.uk email address!! Get your email address today. This has been extended to allow more time for Provincial Grand Knights, Provincial Officers and Council Grand Knights to get in contact.

Is it secure?

This is the question we are sometimes asked. If you are unsure then the following will explain and allay any fears you have:

Our Office365 system has been set up with anti-phishing, anti-malware, and anti-virus protections in place (as much as we can).

Whilst we can provide some security, we cannot guarantee that the system is 100% secure, like any system worldwide.

Where possible phishing emails and malware emails are tracked by the system and, where possible quarantined by the system and not delivered to inboxes.

With regards to personal attacks, this is out of our purview as an organisation. Nothing in 100% guaranteed in life, and in computers .

If a user receives a spam email, then this is automatically put into their "junk email" folder. It is left entirely to the user to protect their own computers. We cannot do that for them. All we can do is advise all users that they protect themselves.

I have worked in computer systems for over 30 years and as such I have seen major improvements in security of computer systems.

Are we totally safe from attack? No - no-one ever is.

Do we have protections in place? - Yes, as much as we can including anti-phishing, anti-malware, anti-spyware, and encryption.

Does nothing get through? No - hackers have always been one step ahead of the game, however attacks are few and far between in getting through. Personal protection is for the end-user to organise themselves by installing a good anti-virus software. This in theory provides an extra layer of security.

As we have built the system using only @ksc.org.uk email addresses then personal information on the system is kept to a minimum, unless users decide to include personal details when they use the email system. Again, that is a personal choice.

I have looked at, and do on a regular basis, the reports that I receive from Microsoft about our email system, and I can confirm that in the last 6 weeks we have had only 1 email sent to the quarantine, no phishing emails, no emails that contain any recognised malware contained in emails.

I hope that this has answers any such queries. However, if Brothers have any further questions, please feel free to ask them, contact me directly by email and I will answer those queries.
