National Action Project – We have about 3 months left so please raise and send funds for The John Foster Memorial Home.

Abortion in Scotland – on 12th May I received an email from John Deighan of SPUC regarding the Women's Health Minister Maree Todd announcement that the home abortions scheme in Scotland are to continue. However, in a letter to Committee members, she revealed that she has made the decision before a promised safety evaluation is completed. SPUC consider this to be a reckless policy which leaves women to suffer the effects of abortion at home, with no medical supervision or support, and then forces them to dispose of foetal remains on their own. This policy even deprives women of the opportunity to meet with a doctor in person.

Tempus fugit. Time flies, brothers. It is hard to believe that the summer is upon us once more. This year, June opens and closes with Solemnities. On Sunday 5th June, we celebrate the great Solemnity of Pentecost—traditionally celebrated as the birthday of the Church—and on Wednesday 29th June, we celebrate the Solemnity of Saints Peter and Paul, when we mark the martyrdom of two of the Church's greatest saints. Celebrating birth and death; we Catholics really are a strange bunch! Yet, these solemnities point to the way in which we—as Catholics and as Knights of St Columba—are called to live our lives. What was the point of the Holy Spirit's descent upon the Apostles and Our Lady on that first Pentecost if not that they would be willing and able to live a life of service to God and His Church? Why did Peter and Paul willingly go to their deaths if not because that life of service can sometimes lead us where we would rather not go? It is unlikely that a life of service within the Order of the Knights of St Columba will ever lead to a cross or a sword, but it should not surprise us if and when suffering follows in the footsteps of service. In our ever more secular society, one who (inspired by the Holy Spirit) remains faithful to the call to serve is sure to suffer; we might all experience ridicule, indifference, and hostility from time to time. I am certain many of us have already experienced one or more of these realities. We might be forgiven for asking ourselves why we do it, then. Why serve? Why be a Knight of St Columba? Why make use of the Gifts bestowed upon us by the Holy Spirit? Well, what is the alternative? To disregard those Gifts would be a terrible thing; to ignore the call to serve would be positively unchristian. The Solemnity of Saints Peter and Paul reminds us that suffering is not something to be avoided. If we, like the generations that have gone before us, proudly call ourselves Christian, then we must be ready to accept that identification with Christ requires an identification with His suffering. Without a Good Friday, there can be no Easter Sunday and there certainly can be no Pentecost. We take comfort in the Lord's promise that He will be with us always, to the end of time, and we take comfort in the certainty that He and the Father send the Holy Spirit to comfort and counsel us. We are indeed called to serve, which means we are called to suffer. Can we accept these calls as one and the same? Can we face whatever sufferings come our way, with the help of the Spirit who is our Advocate? Peter, Paul and our Blessed Mother could, and God knows how their service to Him and His Church continue to change the world Fr Ryan Black

Please remember Fr Ryan in your prayers as he faces his final exams.

Forms: Last month all the forms went out with the bulletin/newsletter, can I ask Councils to complete the forms and get them back to Head Office as soon as possible.

SW3 forms (Notification of Death) when filling the form please ensure that the form is written in block capitals, particularly NAMES, as when reading it if a mistake is made on the spelling it can cause offence to the family. I have also found embarrassingly that the Next of Kin is not always correct, where the Brother is survived by his widow but the name on the form is a son a daughter, the letter is written to the son or daughter when it should have been the Brother's widow. The current form (March 2021) should be used. It asks for the email address for confirmation. Almost 50% of the time, I put in what it looks like on the form, only to have it returned undeliverable.

It is also a sad fact that a Brother dies and the Council informs me some months later that they have just found out! If councils were doing as they have repeatedly been requested to do and kept in regular contact with all Brothers, widows and clergy, this would not happen. In our conversation, we can ensure that they have our contact details written down, so family members can contact us.

Columba Magazine

The Summer Edition of Columba Magazine will be with you all shortly. It will be a little late in being delivered in June. This is because we needed to allow time for our new Ecclesiastical Advisor Bishop Tom Neylon to embed himself in our Order and send us his first article.

KSC Email System

We are already setting up the email addresses and are waiting for Provincial Officers from <u>all</u> <u>Provinces</u> to get in contact to get set up. We are also now adding Council Grand Knights to the system. If you are a Provincial Officer or Council Grand Knight you will need to contact Brother Sean Smith on 07786 003737 to get yourself set up (this phone number <u>must not be sent to anyone who is not an Officer in the Order</u>). Get in contact as soon as you can,

Remember: After June 2022 the Order will not be emailing any personal email addresses. We will be sending all correspondence to your @ksc.org.uk email address!! Get your email address today. This has been extended to allow more time for Provincial Grand Knights, Provincial Officers and Council Grand Knights to get in contact.

Is it secure?

This is a question we are sometimes asked. If you are unsure then the following will explain and allay any fears you have:

Our Office365 system has been set up with anti-phishing, anti-malware, and anti-virus protections in place (as much as we can).

Whilst we can provide some security, we cannot guarantee that the system is 100% secure, like any system worldwide.

Where possible phishing emails and malware emails are tracked by the system and, where possible quarantined by the system and not delivered to inboxes.

With regards to personal attacks, this is out of our purview as an organisation. Nothing is 100% guaranteed, in life, and in computers.

If a user receives a spam email, then this is automatically put into their "junk email" folder. It is left entirely to the user to protect their own computers. We cannot do that for them. All we can do is advise all users that they protect themselves.



Media

I have worked in computer systems for over 30 years and as such I have seen major improvements in security of computer systems.

Are we totally safe from attack? No - no-one ever is.

Do we have protections in place? - Yes, as much as we can including anti-phishing, anti-malware, anti-spyware, and encryption.

Does nothing get through? No - hackers have always been one step ahead of the game, however attacks are few and far between in getting through. Personal protection is for the end-user to organise themselves by installing a good anti-virus software. This in theory provides an extra layer of security.

As we have built the system using only @ksc.org.uk email addresses then personal information on the system is kept to a minimum, unless users decide to include personal details when they use the email system. Again, that is a personal choice.

I have looked at, and do on a regular basis, the reports that I receive from Microsoft about our email system, and I can confirm that in the last 6 weeks we have had only 1 email sent to the quarantine, no phishing emails, and no emails that contain any recognised malware contained in emails.

I hope that this answers any such queries. However, if Brothers have any further questions, please feel free to ask them to contact me directly by email and I will answer those queries.

KSC Website 2022 Version

Work is still progressing on our new Website. A "soft launch" will be given to the Board of Directors at their next Meeting in late June before it is showcased at Supreme Council in October.
