Brecbannoch Pilgrimage - Congratulations to all those that took part in the inaugural Brecbannoch Pilgrimage from 11-13th June 2022. The Brecbannoch is a 50-mile pilgrimage undertaken on foot from Oban to Iona, with the special purpose of praying for the renewal of the faith in Scotland. Along the way, they carried the relics of St Columba, St Andrew and St Margaret. The relics of St Columba returned to Iona for the first time since the reformation. Pictured below you can see the relics being taken into the chapel by Fathers O'Donnell and Campbell. Since his death in 574 AD, pilgrims have flocked to Iona to ask for St Columba's Intercession. Brecbannoch is translated as 'pointy thing' referring to the actual relic box.

Important:

SW4a Special needs allowance, As the cost of living rises, many brothers may be faced with difficult decisions, do they eat or do they heat their home, finances can stretch only so far, paying dues to the Knights of St Columba would not even come into their thinking or consideration.

If it is felt a brother <u>legitimately</u>, cannot afford to pay his dues, it is not a reason to leave the Order, we have the facility in place to help, the council should speak to the brother, and reassure him and tell him not to worry about his dues and claim special needs for him.

No Brother should leave the Order because he genuinely is unable to pay his dues.

<u>Vocations:</u> We each have a calling in life and we as the lay apostolate rely on other people to answer the calling to particular vocations, we rely on men coming forward to join the priesthood, to keep our churches open, so we can hear Mass in our local church, with clergy on hand to administer to our needs, such as baptisms, weddings, ministering to the sick and for funerals.

Some Catholics have to travel up to 20 miles to attend the church, and some of them are covered by another parish

In the bigger cities we are fortunate to have churches near our home, something I have never appreciated how lucky I am until now, if I was to draw a 5-mile radius from my home I have 18 catholic churches with only 2 of those served from a neighbouring parish.

Even in those parishes there is a worry, many of those parishes are served by clergy who are in their late 60 and 70's therefore looking to retire soon, many of the others are blessed to have priests form overseas, with Seminary's closing due to a decline in numbers, my local seminary, St Johns Wonersh, closed with the following statement being published by the diocese.

"Following extensive consideration and discernment, especially over the past year, including communication with the Congregation for the Clergy in Rome, the Trustees have regretfully come to the decision that St John's Seminary cannot continue in its present form. The **current and projected number of seminarians is too small** to sustain a healthy formation community, and the building and staffing costs have simply become prohibitive". (16th October 2020).

What can we do as Knights of St Columba?

Media

Is it secure?

This is a question we are sometimes asked. If you are unsure then the following will explain and allay any fears you have:

Our Office365 system has been set up with anti-phishing, anti-malware, and anti-virus protections in place (as much as we can).

Whilst we can provide some security, we cannot guarantee that the system is 100% secure, like any system worldwide.

Where possible phishing emails and malware emails are tracked by the system and, where possible quarantined by the system and not delivered to inboxes.

With regards to personal attacks, this is out of our purview as an organisation. Nothing is 100% guaranteed, in life, and in computers.

If a user receives a spam email, then this is automatically put into their 'junk email' folder. It is left entirely to the user to protect their own computers. We cannot do that for them. All we can do is advise all users that they protect themselves.

I have worked in computer systems for over 30 years and as such I have seen major improvements in security of computer systems.

Are we totally safe from attack? No - no-one ever is.

Do we have protections in place? - Yes, as much as we can including anti-phishing, anti-malware, anti-spyware, and encryption.

Does nothing get through? No - hackers have always been one step ahead of the game, however attacks are few and far between in getting through. Personal protection is for the end-user to organise themselves by installing a good anti-virus software. This in theory provides an extra layer of security.

As we have built the system using only @ksc.org.uk email addresses then personal information on the system is kept to a minimum, unless users decide to include personal details when they use the email system. Again, that is a personal choice.

I have looked at, and do on a regular basis, the reports that I receive from Microsoft about our email system, and I can confirm that in the last 6 weeks we have had only 1 email sent to the quarantine, no phishing emails, and no emails that contain any recognised malware contained in emails.

I hope that this answers any such queries. However, if Brothers have any further questions, please feel free to ask them to contact me directly by email and I will answer those queries.
