It's become Apparent that PGKs and GKs are leaving Office without the jewels to acknowledge their hard work. This isn't fair on them and I feel they are being let down by their Provinces and Councils. Please feel free to engrave the rear of the jewel too (please refer to my past training modules For the correct placement of these jewels) also there are cases of Brothers who have Resorted to ordering their own jewels, in some cases incorrectly, leading to confusion.

If you have served more than one term in either Office, you are only entitled to wear <u>one</u> Jewel per Office held. Each subsequent term of Office is then awarded a 'bar' which then is Fitted to the ribbon of the jewel. Please do not wear more jewels than you are eligible for. The only jewel where more than one can be worn is the Meritorious Service Jewel.

Vocations continued from last month:

With seminaries closing throughout the UK, such as Ushaw Collage and St Johns Wonersh due to low numbers of men answering the call to the Priesthood and Diaconate, many of our young men go to Rome to train, in the English and Scotch collages.

I was subsequently contacted by Brother Jim Holroyd, whom some of you will know from Province 5 and Supreme Council, who is the Hon. Secretary for the Friends of the Venerable, who support those in the English Collage in Rome.

The Venerable English Collage in Rome originally founded in 1362 as a pilgrim hospice, it was refunded in 1579 a place of training for men from England and Wales, and it was one of the Seminary collages founded at the birth of the Counter Reformation by Pope Gregory XIII and Cardinal Allen.

Get your email address today. This has been extended to allow more time for Provincial Grand Knights, Provincial Officers, Council Grand Knights and Council Officers to get in contact.

Is it secure?

This is a question we are sometimes asked. If you are unsure then the following will explain and allay any fears you have:

Our Office365 system has been set up with anti-phishing, anti-malware, and anti-virus protections in place (as much as we can).

Whilst we can provide some security, we cannot guarantee that the system is 100% secure, like any system worldwide. Where possible phishing emails and malware emails are tracked by the system and, where possible quarantined by the system and not delivered to inboxes.



With regards to personal attacks, this is out of our purview as an organisation. Nothing is 100% guaranteed, in life, and in computers.

If a user receives a spam email, then this is automatically put into their "junk email" folder. It is left entirely to the user to protect their own computers. We cannot do that for them. All we can do is advise all users that they protect themselves.

I have worked in computer systems for over 30 years and as such I have seen major improvements in security of computer systems.

Are we totally safe from attack? No - no-one ever is.

Do we have protections in place? - Yes, as much as we can including anti-phishing, anti-malware, anti-spyware, and encryption.

Does nothing get through? No - hackers have always been one step ahead of the game, however attacks are few and far between in getting through. Personal protection is for the end-user to organise themselves by installing a good anti-virus software. This in theory provides an extra layer of security.

As we have built the system using only @ksc.org.uk email addresses then personal information on the system is kept to a minimum, unless users decide to include personal details when they use the email system. Again, that is a personal choice.

I have looked at, and do on a regular basis, the reports that I receive from Microsoft about our email system, and I can confirm that in the last 6 weeks we have had only 1 email sent to the quarantine, no phishing emails, and no emails that contain any recognised malware contained in emails.

I hope that this answers any such queries. However, if Brothers have any further questions, please feel free to ask them to contact me directly by email and I will answer those queries.
