Action & Social

55th Anniversary of the Abortion Act – We were recently contacted by Bro Terry Graham of Council 29 (Middlesbrough). He is the Northern Development Officer for the Society for the Protection of Unborn Children (SPUC). He has recently been given the task of developing SPUC prayer resources to encourage more people to pray for respect for life and for the work of SPUC. The 27th October 2022 will mark exactly 55 years since the Abortion Act was passed in 1967 and Bro Terry hopes to launch a campaign of prayer in October to draw attention to the nearly 10,000,000 lives lost to abortion in the past 55 years. His intention is that in the six months between 27th October 2022 and 27th April 2023 (the latter date being the anniversary of the Abortion Act coming into effect) SPUC supporters, Churches and Pro-Lifers will rededicate themselves to prayer for respect for life in commemoration of the millions of lives lost. We will discuss with him and formulate a plan.

<u>Relics of St Bernadette</u> – The tour takes place during September and October 2022. I have circulated the dates and locations to the Order and asked for Councils/Provinces to make direct contact with whichever Church or Cathedral they can offer support to.

Nation Action Survey – I was very disappointed with the lack of response to the National Action Survey. Out of over 200 Councils we only had 15 Forms back on time, and even a couple of those were not completed correctly. The winners of the Charles Ferro trophy will be announced at Supreme Council.

Divine Mercy Bus – I am most grateful to the Supreme Knight, Supreme Directors and Brothers that supported the Mercy Bus initiative, as I was unable to attend. The updates and photographs on social media looked amazing.

<u>The current National Action Project</u> - The John Foster Memorial Home, will be presented with the handover cheque at Supreme Council. Mrs Sheila Hargreaves has confirmed her attendance (subject to Past Supreme Knight Ken's health). This is a final request to pay any National Action Project monies ASAP to Head Office.

The next National Action project from October 2022 is 'Let the Children live" a project based in Columbia. The charity has a limited marketing budget but have ordered an initial 6000 leaflets to give out at Supreme Council. Father Peter will provide testimonies, personal videos and appeals, and we intend to spread stories and topics out over the two years to keep interest going after the initial launch. Hopefully we can link to YouTube and a 'Just Giving' page. Miss Pauline Allan, the Administrator of Let the Children Live! will be joining us at Supreme Council.

What is a life worth?

Sadly, in today's society, not a lot. A baby can now be aborted at home, the expectant mother only needs to see her GP – to get the home abortion pill.

Originally brought in to ease pressure during the pandemic as of 23rd August it has now been made permanent, the pandemic once more used as an excuse to get this in while people's attention was drawn away, eroding still further the importance of that babies life.

The pill being available for up to the first 10 weeks of pregnancy, but this must come with risk to the mother, if there is excessive bleeding, or all the foetus does not come away fully, has the possibility to cause the death of the mother.

There is a group strongly pushing for abortion up till birth. How can this be right? We cannot call it murder as the baby has not been born, but what is the difference? Abortion still denies the chance of life to that child.

Assisted suicide

The former Health Secretary, Matt Hancock has stated in The Express newspaper, that he thinks that a free vote should be given to MP's when the subject of Assisted Suicide is put before the House of Commons.

According to the right to life website Mr. Handcock came under intense public criticism.

Be in no doubt Brothers that should assisted suicide be passed into law, then it will be used to save money, guilt of not wanting to be a burden on the family will be one tool used to persuade the patient to accept assistance to end their life.
