Brothers

One of the most iconic symbols of Advent is that of the Advent Wreath. It is a beautiful symbol of the eternity of Christ and his presence in our lives. As a symbol, however, apart from being lit on each of the Sundays of Advent, the deeper meaning held within each of those candles is often lost or unacknowledged. This is a pity because there is a richness in the wreath which offers a real opportunity for reflecting in a prayerful way this beautiful season of preparation for Christmas. Before we look at how we might use our Advent Wreath for a time of reflection let us remind ourselves of its origins.

The Advent Wreath was first used as Christian devotion in the Middle Ages. Its design comes from the customs of the pre-Christian Germanic and Scandinavian cultures, where candles and greenery were used as symbols of light and life during the dark and cold winter. The Advent Wreath has always been a circular evergreen wreath with four or five candles, three purple, one rose and sometimes a white candle for Christmas Day placed in the centre of the wreath.

The candles symbolise the light of Christ coming into the world. The evergreen symbolises renewal and the circular shape the completeness of God. The candle colours come from the traditional liturgical colours of Advent, (purple and rose) and Christmas (white). Each candle is lit on the appropriate Sunday of Advent and then the candles can be lit each day according to the week. Overtime each candle was given a name and linked to a particular part of the Advent story.

Candle 1. Hope (purple) Candle 2. Peace (purple) Candle 3. Joy (rose) Candle 4. Love (purple)

Praying with a focus on each candle can really help us to reflect as we journey through Advent. Just taking fifteen or twenty minutes each day to pray can enrich our appreciation of the season which so often can be overtaken by the need to shop endlessly, bake, send out invites etc. Simply giving a short period of time allows us to breathe and refocus on why we are doing all this preparation in the first place.

On behalf of Trish and myself and the Board of Directors we would like to wish you all a very happy and Holy Christmas and a peaceful New Year

May St Columba protect you all and keep you safe.

KSC COUNCIL 110 RESPONSE TO SUPREME COUNCIL PAPERS 2022 WITH ADDITIONAL REFERENCES TO EARLIER DISCUSSIONS WITH SUPREME KNIGHT AND DIRECTORS

KSC Council 110 discussed the Supreme Council 2022 papers (helpfully provided by Bro Stephen McMillan Regional Director Area 3) at its meeting on Monday 12 September. The following notes have been produced following those discussions and incorporate some issues/questions which were not considered during the Supreme Knight's meeting at KSC 110 Club on 27 July 2022.

These notes and questions follow, where possible, the format of the Supreme Council papers and also are produced in line with the deadline for comments offered in the Audit Finance and Governance report (page 33) and submitted via the Regional Director.

General

There are presentational errors which have caused some confusion viz:

• the pack received comprises 174 pages; the agenda refers to 211;

• the membership report (page 75) indicates a membership of 2791; the CBF report (page 41) states more than 4000;

- the agenda 11.1 refers to Audit.....report of 19/20;
- we have assumed that items below Total Income on page 36 relate to Expenditure for the same period.

Audit, Finance and Governance Report

There is no audit; the Chartered Accountants confirm that they have not carried out an audit of (presumably) the Central Account (CA) and there is an Independent Examination of the Central Benevolant (sic) Fund (CBF).

Unlike previous years and normal practice there are no notes to the CA accounts covering eg accounting policies, property and fixtures and, particularly, the loan from CBF to Central Account and usually described as an integral part of the accounts.

There is no indication that the agreed 3% interest rate on the CBF loan has been charged nor is there any clarity if the "underpayments" from previous years (when the 3% was not paid) would be caught up.

For the CA, "Other income" is given as £21602 (almost 11.5% of the total income) but there are no explanatory notes.

More detail is given on the CBF investments portfolio, which is a good development, albeit at a different date to the accounts.

What is the current situation with VAT registration? Has the Order's status been changed? If so with what result?

Has the issue with stock undervaluation now been fully resolved? Are systems in place to ensure no repetition?

Have the bank accounts been rationalised?

Special Committee

There is still concern that the new arrangements have introduced another layer of management at a time when membership is now below 3,000.

Directors

It would be helpful if there was a requirement for the Director to share material relating to the governance and management of the Order and consult with Councils on the content to demonstrate accountability to the membership.

Provincial Grand Knights

Purpose/Role 7 states that PGK may speak and vote independently of the Board (presumably of Directors). This implies that Directors may not. Does this not cut across the Director's role in being the link between Councils and the BoD?

Membership

There are gaps in the report which, presumably, will be supplied in advance of the Supreme Council.

Media

The design of the website is a significant improvement.

We support the inclusion in the Members' Area, copies of the latest Handbooks, BoD meeting papers and minutes, Supreme Council papers and minutes.

Email system

We are not convinced about the enforced @ksc.org.uk email system. GK Council 110 has not received any electronic communication despite notifying Head Office repeatedly of his (non-KSC) email address. We agree that the rationale/process has not been well publicised, explained or suggested benefits made clear.

Columba Magazine

We believe that the publication dates should be publicised at the start of each year with deadlines for contributions and adhered to – to prevent significant gaps in publication.

Social media

We agree that social media is useful for Councils when used sensibly but are unhappy with the somewhat draconian threat to close down Council run pages. Is the Order really saying that it wants control of information on local social or spiritual events which are often used to promote the Order and its activities beyond the membership (closed group)? Do you envision a similar approach where Councils use eg Parish websites to promote?

Governance

What is the rationale for looking to establish a company limited by guarantee? What are the likely benefits and costs eg meeting company law reporting requirements?

Have the rules of CBF been changed to permit the loaning of money to CA?

Supreme Council 2022 Finance & Governance Questions

We have received 8 Questions on the Accounts and 2 Questions on Governance.

Question 1; No Audit.

The law in Scotland to us does not require an Audit on the Central Account. To do an Audit the cost to the Order would be approx. £10K. There is an Independent Examiners report on the CBF as required by OSCR(Scottish Charities Commission)

Question 2. Notes, accounting policies are on Pages 46-47 also on CBF.

Page 36-37 state the value of Head Office. I again, as I stated last year one needs to read carefully about the Loan from CBF to CA. Its there on Page 37 Current Liabilities.

Question 3; Yes, we have correctly applied 3% interest to the debt from CBF to CA. Last year we only applied 1% due to the unknown effect of the Pandemic on the Orders Finances. The Board are conscious of the current "Living Expenses" and financial difficulties in the UK. We believe that we may need extra funds to help our brothers & families.

Question 4. Central Account – Other Income of $\pounds 21,602$. This was the final part of the Insurance claim on the flood in HO.

Question 5. Seems a statement instead of a question but the different date that is expressed is only the date that the accounts were finalised by the Accountants, SK and myself –June 2022.

Question 6. Current situation on VAT; The Order is no longer VAT registered. We have gained a small amount by doing so, it will become more apparent in the following years accounts.

Question 7. Stock Revaluation. Yes, Head Office Staff overseen by SK, myself have done a thorough in-depth Stock Check. There are controls in place.

Question 8. Bank Accounts. We are operating with the minimum of Bank accounts, these may change if question 10 goes ahead.

Governance

Question 9. Rules of CBF changed re loans to Orders CA? No changes have been made. If the Sub Committee being formed re CBF this will be added.

Question 10; Company Limited by guarantee. I will ask the Supreme Knight to bring us all up to date on this query. —We hope to be in a position to inform the Order later this year and to bring notice to SC 2023.

Action & Social

The new Action & Social Committee meet for the first time on teams on the 7th November. They are 4 Brothers of many years' experience of both local and national concerns. The role of the Committee was to;

- Liaise with all Action Convenors to offer support and training if needed.
- Be the support to all, action incorporates all areas (Membership, Welfare, Youth and Media).
- Invigorate all, both Councils and Parishes to enlighten the faith.

55th Anniversary of the Abortion Act - The 27th October 2022 marked exactly 55 years since the Abortion Act was passed in 1967 and to which nearly 10,000,000 lives were lost.

From Between 27th October 2022 and 27th April 2023 (the latter date being the anniversary of the Abortion Act coming into effect) SPUC supporters, Churches and Pro-Lifers will rededicate themselves to prayer for respect for life in commemoration of the millions of lives lost. Thousands of leaflets have been distributed with the KSC & SPUC logos on them and sent out across the UK.

We will be holding a rosary every month for the next 6 months on 24th November, 22nd December, 19th January 2023, 16th February 2023, and finally 16th March 2023.

We are also hoping to hold a 40hr Adoration at the end of April 2023 at Middleborough Cathedral to finish off the 6-month Appeal. We have had the first of these held by our Ecclesiastical Advisor Bishop Tom Neylon on teams. But to connect with the most people we have decided to hold the rest over zoom, this means we can put the rosary over Facebook and the website.

National Pilgrimages – It is intended that by the end December we circulate a list of dates for all known Knights Pilgrimages across the UK in 2023. This will be advertised in the Columba magazine and e-Columba. Please can you send your pilgrimage dates to apostolates@ksc.org.uk for inclusion.

200 Club – the 200 club membership currently stand at 129 members with most members renewing their membership for next year. I am doing an email address to all councils and provinces to recruit more members. This brings in funds for the order as a whole but also encourages brothers to engage with the chance of winning something for themselves. We need to bring this up to the full 200 members as it is running at break-even at present.

Golf Day – We are having a golf days dependent on numbers. The date is 11th at Garstang golf course. Accommodation for two nights including Dinner, Breakfast and 18holes per day. Also included would be tea and coffee on arrival.

Christmas Cards – We are pricing up making Christmas cards using the winners of the nativity competition from this year. Using 3 entries with 4 cards of each design on 6×6 cards with verse and our logo on the rear, initial run of 30 packs of 12 cards. These would be sold through the website and head office, hopefully we can find the right pricing and have them ready for Supreme next year.

National Action Project – "Let the Children Live!" – Due to the mix up at the beginning were we had to print 3000 leaflets as the 1's provided did not have our information on them. Most of these were handed out at Supreme Council with just a few going back to head office. So I have said it is best that the PGK's who have some left to pass around their councils, until we have new stock or print out some if we put the master onto the website. Now those have been handed out we have asked for the charity to print some more for us to hand out to councils and interested persons. The Charity has replied with they have no monies to print any more due to printing the initial run. May have to wait until we get some monies for the appeal and use some of that to print more (just a suggestion).

Derry & Knock Pilgrimage – We are arranging a National Pilgrimage for the last week in May 2023. Flying out of Manchester & Edinburgh 25th May and flying back from Knock on 29th May. The cost including travel and accommodation is £675 each for 2 sharing or £850 single supplement. Details are now available from Head Office.

Grand National Draw – the tickets have now been approved and will be posted out in the coming weeks from Head Office. We will push this after the Advent Season across the Order as again the profits from this helps the running of Action & Youth Projects. I respectfully ask our Regional Directors to focus on this as it's our biggest source of income to do good works, and we have missed out on the last couple of years sales due to the covid lockdowns.

Mercy Bus – the Committee are looking at running the mercy bus around the south of England and Wales. To do this we need to collaborate with other catholic societies to make this feasible. We would also need the provinces to step up with help supplying the priests to hold confessions and brothers to help on the bus. We will be looking at the cost of the bus/ minibus and if we can get some sponsorship to alleviate the costs.

As we look forward to Christmas, and we enter the time of preparation, without this event in the churches calendar we would not have Christianity, we would not have the promise of eternal life with God the father.

The word "Advent" is derived from the Latin word adventus, meaning "coming," which is a translation of the Greek word Parousia. Most know Advent today as a time of anticipation and expectation of the birth of Christ.

What Is the Advent Wreath?

Advent candles shine brightly in the midst of darkness, symbolizing and reminding us that Jesus came as Light into our dark world.

It is thought the Advent wreath first appeared in Germany in 1839. A Lutheran minister working at a mission for children created a wreath out of the wheel of a cart. He placed twenty small red candles and four large white candles inside the ring. The red candles were lit on weekdays and the four white candles were lit on Sundays.

Eventually, the Advent wreath was created out of evergreens, symbolizing everlasting life in the midst of winter and death as the evergreen is continuously green. The circle reminds us of God's unending love and the eternal life He makes possible.

The Advent wreath is a symbol of the season, with a candle lit each of the four Sundays leading up to, and on Christmas Day. The light of the flickering candle flames reminds us who Jesus is: "*In him was life, and that life was the light of all mankind. The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it.*" (John 1:4-5). Advent candles are often nestled in the evergreen wreath. Additional decorations, like holly and berries, are sometimes added. Their red colour points ahead to Jesus' sacrifice and death on the cross, shedding his blood for our sins.

First Advent Candle: The first purple candle symbolizes hope. Also known as the "Prophecy Candle" in memory of the prophets, particularly Isaiah, who prophesied the birth of Christ. It symbolizes the anticipation felt in awaiting the coming Messiah.

Second Advent Candle: The second purple candle symbolizes faith. Also known as the "Bethlehem Candle," signifies Mary and Joseph's journey to Bethlehem.

Third Advent Candle: The third candle is ordinarily pink and represents joy. This candle is pink because the rose colour represents joy, also known as the "Shepherd's Candle." The third Sunday of Advent is meant to remind us of the world's joy at the birth of Jesus and that the faithful have arrived at the midpoint of Advent.

Fourth Advent Candle: The final purple candle marks the last week of Advent as we anticipate the birth of our Saviour. This final candle, also known as the "Angel's Candle," signifies peace. It reminds us of the angels' message: "Peace on Earth, Good Will Toward Men" (Luke 2:14).



Fifth Advent Candle: is lit on Christmas day, symbolises the light that has come into the world. It is good for families to do an advent wreath at home, it will help to focus the children's minds on the true meaning of Christmas, way from Santa and presents.

Remembering those who have died:

It has been my pleasure to join a number of council's and province's memorial mass, both physically and virtually, one of my local council's masses, was held on Remembrance Sunday. On the sanctuary there was a cross that was covered in cut out poppies, the parish priest explained as part of his homily, that it was done by his parish's primary school children.



He pointed out theat one of the popies was different, it was a hand print. When the child was questioned her reply stunned the teacher. The child said, "You said it was for those who gave their lives in the ultimate sacrifice for us, I did the hand of Jesus, the black circle is where the nails went into Jesus's hands, and the red is his blood shed for us".

This was a sharp lesson to me, how as adults we fail miserably to see thing through the innocence of a child.



The Emeritus Archbishop of Glasgow, Archbishop Mario Conti, has died at the age of 88.

The BBC reported



He succeeded Cardinal Thomas Winning as Archbishop of Glasgow in 2002 and retired 10 years later. Born in Elgin, he was a priest for 64 years and a bishop for 45. He was one of the last surviving bishops in the world to have been appointed by Pope Paul VI. One of his proudest moments came when he welcomed Pope Benedict XVI to Britain at the first public Mass of the German Pope's state visit in 2010 at Bellahouston Park in Glasgow.

The Glasgow Times described him as The Emeritus Archbishop of Glasgow Mario Conti has left a lasting legacy across the city he loved - and will be fondly remembered by its people for his compassion, humour and warmth.

He oversaw the renovation of St Andrew's Cathedral and the construction of the adjacent Italian Cloister Garden which remembers the victims of the wartime Arandora Star tragedy.

My personal memories of him. is of a warm caring man who was a staunch supporter of our order and its brothers.

We keep him, his family and the people of Scotland that he served so well, in our thoughts and prayers.
