I hope you are all keeping well.



# Spirituality & Welfare

Relics of St Columba, St Andrew and St Margarete

Dear Brothers,

I must start with a big thank you to Brother Frank Kelly, who picked up the Relics from Carfin along with the Fraternal Cross and the Columba/Columbanus Cross and taking them to Cumbria, where Brother Barry Johnson took it to Birmingham and from Birmingham it was handed over to Brother Paddy Boyle who continued on to Southwark for the start of the tour.

Last month I covered the 3 Saints whose Relics are held in the Reliquary, the Reliquary does not come in a protective case and the Perspex has a slight crack at the bottom which we know about.

#### **The Fraternal Cross:**

The idea of the Fraternal Cross was promoted and developed by Council 184 Wolverhampton.

As a means of Brothers across the country assembling to pray and socialise together.

To this aim it was very successful, so much so it was agreed to a more formalised Pilgrimage, involving all Provinces and as many Councils as possible. Encouraging prayer and Fraternalism in doing so we come together in Unity and in our Charity come together in prayer for the Deceased and for those less fortunate than ourselves, praying for the good of the Order that it may flourish and grow.

The Cross is mounted on a timber plaque and is surrounded by the names of the of the countries where the Orders in the International Alliance of Catholic Knights operate.

Many of the IACK Orders now have their own Fraternal Crosses.

### The Columba/Columbanus Cross

The Cross was presented to us at Supreme Council 2019 by the Knights of Saint Columbanus (Ireland) to celebrate our centenary.

The Cross is in the form of a Celtic Cross.

The **Celtic cross** is a form of Christian Cross featuring a nimbus or ring that emerged in Ireland, France and Great Britain in the Early Middle Ages. A type of ringed Cross, it became widespread through its use in the stone high Crosses erected across the islands, especially in regions evangelized by Irish missionaries, from the ninth through the 12th centuries.





The Celtic cross is essentially a Latin cross with a nimbus surrounding the intersection of the arms and stem. Scholars have debated its exact origins, but it is related to earlier crosses featuring rings. The form gained new popularity during the Celtic Revival of the 19th century; the name "Celtic cross" is a convention dating from that time. The shape, usually decorated with interlace know by most as a Celtic knot and other motifs from Insular art, became popular for funerary monuments and other uses, and has remained so, spreading well beyond Ireland.

It is made from Irish Oak, it is beautifully carved, it comes in its own case.

To answer some of the questions, The dimensions of which are 700mm Hight, 445mm With and 300mm Depth and weighs 30KG. it is suggested that 2 people lift and carry it.

I ask all brothers to take good care of all three items and keep the cases together with the crosses, the last time our fraternal cross went around the country the case was left in a church and the cross handed on to the next council, subsequently the case and the fraternal cross were damaged and had to be repaired, please remember they are in your care, and you have a responsibility to look after them.

I ask provincial Grand Knights and Regional Directors to send me and the Regional Director for Region 6 an email advising me of where it is and where it is going giving time and dates please. We do need to know where it is at all times.

Brother Sean Smith, Supreme Director for Media and Brother George Johnson Regional Director, Region 6 has produced a tri-fold leaflet giving date and places early advice of dates and movements will help him to produce a leaflet for your area.

### Memorial Mass 2023

My thanks to all who attended the Mass and to our Ecclesiastical Advisor Bishop Tom for saying the Mass for us, I also thank Brother Ray Pealing (Province 2) for all of his assistance in arranging the Mass and overseeing proceedings on my behalf, as despite booking and paying for train tickets due to migraine I was not able to travel.

Unfortunately, we were not able to live stream and as Claire the cathedral administrator had two family bereavements her sister 3 weeks prior to the Mass and her mother the Sunday before the Mass, (our thoughts and prayers are with her and them) but I thank our Supreme Knight and the SD for Media Brother Sean Smith for stepping in at short notice to stream the Mass on Zoom.

The Order of Service was from 2019 and not 2023. My apologies for any confusion caused, but despite the problems it was a very prayerful and spiritual Mass and homily by Bishop Tom. It was fitting that Mrs Jane Woods carried one of the Memorial Books as her father Brother Pat Hudson (Past Director) was only entered into the book this year also the mass we offered the Mass for the Deceased Members of the KSC family that included her mother who died in May last year, and all family Members of the Knights.

### Action & Social

Dear Brothers,

**200** Club – We are now at 135 members. We as a board made the decision to ask all councils to take a number in the 200 club as yet, as of writing we have only just put out the request, so we will see how many take up our request. This brings in funds for the order as a whole but also encourages brothers to engage with the chance of winning something for themselves. We need to bring this up to the full 200 members as it is running at break-even at present, and hopefully if the councils all take a number we could possibly have up to 400 members.

The order has been running at a loss due to the lack of numbers being taken. We have taken the decision that until it become more feasible we are reducing the number of prizes down from 4 to 3. So from March Draw we are having a £50 top prize and 2 £25 prizes. This is until we can get the club running at its maximum.

**55th Anniversary of the Abortion Act -** The 27th October 2022 marked exactly 55 years since the Abortion Act was passed in 1967 and to which nearly 10,000,000 lives were lost. From Between 27th October 2022 and 27th April 2023 (the latter date being the anniversary of the Abortion Act coming into effect). We held a monthly rosary for the 6 months prior to the 27 April, then held the 40hr Adoration from St Thomas More Church in Middlesborough and vis zoom. The only zoom attendance was good with many councils giving up an hr to say the rosary or leading us in prayers. The congregation at St Thomas More was very engaging with many different groups from the area holding prayers and the rosary both during the day and night time. Thousands of leaflets have been distributed with the KSC & SPUC logos on them and sent out across the UK. Due to some problems and the parish priest wishing to include the Feast of St. Gianna Molla, whose relic is at St. Thomas More's and who's been very much the patroness of the National Prayer Campaign we decided to start on the 27th April until the 29th of April to accommodate this.

**Golf Day** – The Golf day has been arranged for July 11th, to be held at Garstang Golf centre. We have interest from around 14 people so it will be going ahead, please contact <u>apostolates@ksc.org.uk</u> to add your name. The cost is £163 per person sharing a room it includes Accommodation for two nights including Dinner, Breakfast and 18 holes per day. Also included would be tea and coffee on arrival.

New National Action Project 2024/25 – Brothers I am hoping you are all hard at work raising funds for the current NAP. As you are all aware we are going through a severe economic crisis both nationally at in out homes. The "Let the Children live" charity is asking we don't forget them as they are finding there funds drying up and the cost of living costs are hitting hard into their reserves and need out help badly. To be positive and outline what a council is doing for the current NAP. We are now in the process of taking bids for the new national action project for 2024/25. The closing date for submissions is going to be June 2023, with the best going forward to supreme 2023 for nominations. As of yet we have had only 3 submissions from the order. I have received an update from Columbia on how things are. It is a bit long but please read and pass around as we have a year left to support this worthwhile cause.





Excerpt from a recent Update sent from Colombia by Fr Peter Walters, Plus New Intercessions.....February 2023 "Although Medellín is still a violent city, it is no longer the murder capital of the western hemisphere; and none of our children have been killed in the last few years. The city authorities like to boast that there are no longer any street-children here, but the same social problems - such as poverty, family break-up and abuse - that forced children on to the streets in the past are still very much with us now. However, when children leave home now they know that if they are found sleeping in the street, they are likely to be taken to a secure unit in the local mental hospital; and that they may be detained there indefinitely in protective custody. This is perfectly legal; and as far as I am aware, the children are well-treated there: but they are locked in. Consequently, those who wish to avoid this fate tend to take refuge at night in the drug-dens and the brothels, or to engage in some sort of activity - pick-pocketing, mugging, prostitution or selling drugs - to obtain enough money to pay for a room for the night in some sort of doss-house. The problem has therefore not been solved: it has simply been driven underground." Prayer: For the children and young teenagers of Medellín who are still living in the city's streets. For those who have become involved with drugs or prostitution. "As the situation of the children has changed, the work of Let The Children Live! has evolved to meet it. All of our beneficiaries are at high social risk, and they currently include: a) Boys and girls with special educational needs, for whom no provision is made in the local State schools. Some of our children are in classes of 50 or more, and the teachers have neither the skills nor the time to give them the individual attention that they need. Such children inevitably get bored, and they often get into trouble which may result in their deserting school or being expelled. They are then all too likely to get snapped up by the criminal gangs - of which there are more than 400 in the city. And once that happens it is very hard for them to get out again alive. We therefore try to provide them - and their teachers - with the special support that they need to stay at school." Prayer: For our children with special educational needs, that we will have the funds to be able to continue helping and looking after them. That they will not believe the promises made to them by the gangs and will not become involved with them. b) "Girls who become pregnant at a very early age. For example, one of our girls sought our help when she became pregnant at the age of 11. She had her baby just after her own 12th birthday. All too often such girls drop out of school and then find themselves having to rely on a series of useless men who are very likely to abuse and abandon them. We therefore provide support for such girls both during their pregnancy and after the birth, helping to provide not only things like food, clothes and nappies, but also classes about baby-care and budgeting. Above all, we aim to help these girls to stay at school. They can bring their babies with them to classes at Casa Walsingham, our day-centre; and these are held at times that are convenient for them. The girl I mentioned earlier obtained her baccalaureate certificate on her son's fifth birthday, and with our support she is now training to be a beautician. She therefore has a chance to build a decent future for herself and her son." Prayer: For all our young mothers and mothers-to-be, and their babies and toddlers. Please pray that with our help they will learn to be good mothers, loving their children and caring for them, so that they do not go into the streets or become involved with prostitution, drugs and crime. The second part of the report will be in next months bulletin. (the full report will be in the Supreme papers)

**Charles Ferro Trophy** – The forms have now gone out to the councils please make sure to have them back by the beginning of June to allow the judges to peruse them. All councils are invited to enter no matter how small, show how much action your council brings to your area. Time is running out for entries.





**May Rosaries** – We had all the dates for the rosary in the month of May covered by different councils and provinces. Which will be held on a Monday night at 7pm. I am thankful for all who participated and hope you all continue to support the Rosary going forward. We have also had the rosary for Youth as well as the daily rosary held at lunch time with Brother Tony Berkeley Monday To Friday.

**Keep Christ In Christmas** – We as the committee was aware had run out of "Keep Christ in Christmas" at head office and was tasked to revamp the design and cost out reprinting the new design. We have a quote from a company to print the stickers on an A4 sheet with 48 stickers per sheet at a cost of 34p per sheet. Now we have been informed that during the moving of head office we have found a box of the old stickers, which may last this year or not as the case maybe. Can we get some stickers printed to make sure we have enough to last and follow on for the next couple of years. I have ask you all for your opinions for the design and found we had a few problems with the colours and fonts. I was asked why we were changing the colours and it was due to the committee wanting to see if we could modernize the design, But I am also hoping that we can get the gold colour paper and if this makes a difference to the cost. Will report at the meeting.

We also looked at making Christmas cards for the order but due to the complexity and cost we have not finalised looking at some companies. Some can print the cards but we would have to send to another company to fold and package the cards with envelopes other are to cost prohibitive. We are trying to keep the cost below £4.50 manufacturing to sell at £5.00 a pack to brothers starting at supreme.

**Mercy Bus** – Unfortunately we are unable to run the mercy bus this year due to unforeseen circumstances, which will be apparent later in the year. We are planning to co-host next years mercy bus with Divine mercy Scotland around the south of England. In 2025 we hope to run the mercy bus ourselves so please as a province or Region put yourselves forward for this event.

# Youth Committee will meet again and will publish the new dates for 2023-2024 Youth and Young People Competitions in July and again in September 2023.
