#### **Action & Social**

**200** Club – We are now at 145 members. We as a board made the decision to ask all councils to take a number in the 200 club as yet, as of writing we have only just put out the request, so we will see how many take up our request. This brings in funds for the order as a whole but also encourages brothers to engage with the chance of winning something for themselves. We need to bring this up to the full 200 members as it is running at break-even at present, and hopefully if the councils all take a number we could possibly have up to 400 members. This increase includes 2 councils who have taken 5 numbers each, but also 4 councils who have not renewed their numbers.

We as an order do these things so we can raise monies without raising dues, I hope you all understand and will support us. The order has been running at a loss due to the lack of numbers being taken. We have taken the decision that until it become more feasible we are reducing the number of prizes down from 4 to 3. So from March Draw last year we are have a £50 top prize and 2 £25 prizes.

**August**: For women and families expecting a child at this time

**September**: For political leaders, that they will act to uphold the sanctity of life

through just laws

**October**: For an end to abortion in the UK

**November**: For the work of SPUC and the KSC in defending the sanctity of life

Feast of Christ the King - Solemn close of the Spiritual Bouquet

We will be having a website to receive all prayer actions from individuals, groups, councils and parishes etc.

We started on the  $28^{th}$  of December the Feast of the Holy Innocents at 6pm with Holy Hour of rosary and prayers.



Then in January the Board of Directors will start us off by doing a weekly intention from their own Parish. We will then be asking councils and parishes to contribute by having a zoom intention i.e. prayers, holy hour, benediction etc. from their own parishes or if we can our cathedrals. I will be writing to all the Bishops of the UK for permission and if we can participation from them in our cause for the run up to the Jubilee 2025.

I will be in touch as we move through the year and update on the website and Facebook, I ask you to take this opportunity to help profess our faith in action and support us in our endeavours.

Then at the end of the bouquet we can present to the Bishops and Papal Nuncio.

**Grand National Draw** – the new grand national draw have come out in the next few weeks. I understand that some people are against horse racing on principle, but it is important to distinguish the draw uses the horse racing content as a way of promoting the fund raising. But please remember that this is the main fund raiser to fund raise the central work of the order – namely Action and Youth activities.

Perhaps this year you can sell to your parish and friends and family. This is namely a raffle in all it functions, so see if you can sell more to your parish promote it just after Christmas and help us to help the Youth and Action projects going forward.

We have changed the design of the ticket to include "raising fund for the youth of today" to further promote our aims for the tickets. I will put out to the order a choice of 3 ways, we can run this in future:

- A. Carry on as we are;
- B. Rename the draw as a raffle and just draw tickets with the prizes being the same,
- C. We make the draw a Christmas raffle and maybe change the size of the prizes to give more out to Brothers.

This should be going out to Brothers at the end of the month and if we go with option C we can go with starting with this Christmas.

Let the Children Live—I have emailed the charity about an update to pass onto Brothers but as yet have had no reply. I do know that Pauline Allen has had a hip replacement just before Christmas so this maybe delaying a reply.

**An Appeal** – A request is in the parish notices for my church from the chaplain for Risley Prison for rosaries, Bibles etc. Warrington, where Risley is located, it is within Province 8, so it could be our responsibility to assist if possible. I am aware, however, of the financial position and so not a great deal may be able to be done, but it is for the Action Committee to decide on this.
