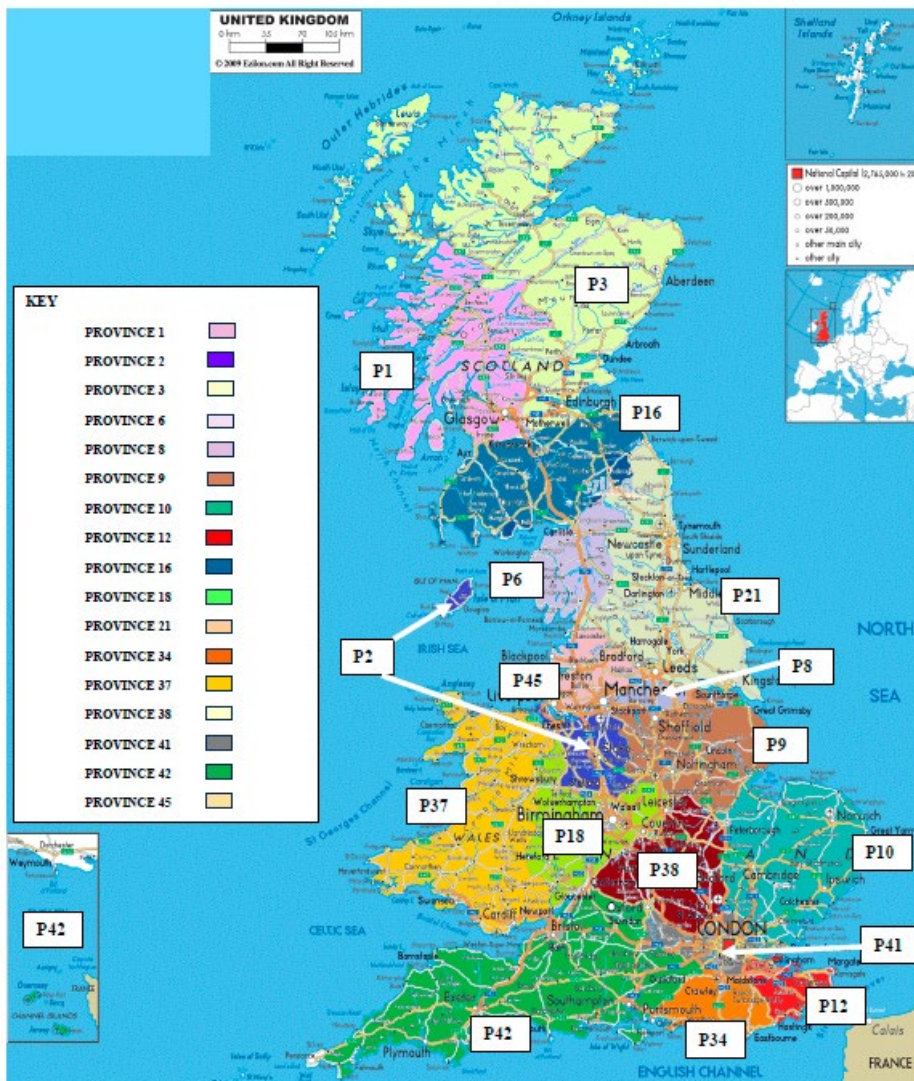


The Supreme Knight

From the Feast of the Holy Innocents on 28th December 2023 to the Solemnity of Christ the King 2024, we will be praying to make abortion unthinkable and to uphold the dignity of all life from conception to a natural death.

We are still looking for Councils and Parishes to contribute to the 40 Hour Adoration which will be at the end of June. This is the perfect chance to follow Pope Francis in this year of prayer.

We have had a wonderful series of Lenten Stations by our Priests and Bishops in this Lenten period and we now continue with our weekly Rosaries, please make every effort to attend these as those who pray together stay together. It is usually held @7pm on a Monday, we are also looking at having just 1 code for all Rosaries throughout the rest of year.

We are having a 40 hr Adoration along with The Miraculous Relic Image of Our Lady of Guadalupe from Poole on 28th to 30th June 2024. It will start at 5pm on the 28th until 9am on Sunday 30th June. We are opening the list for Councils and individuals to book their hour of prayer and Holy Hour.

Don't forget to send your intentions to the SPUC website for your Deceased Members of your family and prayer intentions, please also include that you are a Knight so we can track how many Knights are interacting with the website. Also please ask you Parishioners to do the same.

ST VINCENT DE PAUL SOCIETY

The members of the SVP pledge commitment to three things:

- to work to the sanctification of all members,
- to practice fellowship in groups and
- to let the love practiced together pour out into the world through justice and charity.

In this short report I will use these three lenses to update on growth for the SVP in 2024 onwards.

Works in the world - in recent years the SVP has seen an increase in requests for assistance, the need for further funding into the hands of those in need, increased complexity of needs and emerging forms of poverty. The attached chart gives a flavour of the exponential growth on all these fronts. I am infinitely proud in the growth in membership numbers, increased devotion to spirituality, response to increasing need, training to meet complexity, accessing further funding and boldly visioning another 180 years.

With this in mind if you find someone in need contact your local SVP rep as they have access to funds for hardship and cost of living problems. Catholic Church in England and Wales - Catholic Bishops' Conference (cbcew.org.uk)

Discussion followed during which the following points/questions were raised:



Eucharistic Congress -

As a smaller venue this year, less people will be able to attend. Will there be 'live streaming' of the event - of keynote speakers / Mass? There won't be live streaming of the Mass/Keynote speakers but we are looking at recording the input so they will be available afterwards.

If there is to be 'marketplace' area (as at last Eucharistic Congress in Liverpool), could NCLA have a presence? This is still being worked out – there will be what are called “campus activities” but the nature of these has not been decided yet. I will keep you informed.

Synod – It was felt that the challenge was to keep up enthusiasm for the process.

Some questioned if their responses had been heard. I would recommend all to read the Synthesis report from the October Plenary Assembly. Comparing it with our own national synthesis, there are significant areas of commonality. It would be very difficult to collate every voice specifically from this worldwide contribution, but listening for the echoes of the matters raised by the faithful in the process is very important. Just because explicit mention isn't made of an issue doesn't mean that it isn't being thought about.

Have we been asked “the right questions”? the main question for reflection at this point, which has been directed back to all Dioceses, is, 'How can we be a synodal Church in mission?' The Dioceses have been asked to reflect on this now so that a submission can be made back to the Synod Office by mid-May for the ongoing deliberations.

Have we been “steered” down a path of others making? I think it's important to keep the mission question front and centre. The universal nature of these discussions means that matters important to us here won't be the same as those in other parts of the world. However, we cannot wait for the universal to decide the local; local Churches should be continuing their own discernment of how to be more effective in mission in their own place, using the gifts and talents of all the baptised at this time. Above all, we need to look at the structures we have now which are not being utilised effectively to drive the Church's mission in our Dioceses, so that all can be engaged positively in the mission of the Church.

Fr Christopher also attached the Synod Office worksheet which he suggested might help in the thinking on the Synod. I will be sending out the worksheet separately.

The first casualty of any war, it is often said, is the truth. Yet the first casualty of every war are also the innocent civilians: children, women, the elderly, the disabled, the sick and dying. Homes are razed to the ground, innocent people slaughtered, people are buried deep underneath rubble, the wounded are rushed to hospital and even there may not be safe.

We don't simply pray for peace. We cry out 'O God bring Peace, banish War'.

KSC Email System

We will keep this in our Bulletin for those GKs who need to log into the email system. If you require any assistance, please feel free to email us (from any email account) and we will work with you to get you up and running. We expect this exercise to be completed by the end of April for ALL Councils.

We have now concluded the email system exercise for the Order. This means that in the next three months every Council Grand Knight in the Order will receive an email address. Provincial Grand Knights will receive an envelope for each Council in their Province to distribute to the Council Grand Knight.

Once you receive your envelope you will find a piece of paper detailing your email address and temporary password. **The temporary password will require to be changed on the first time you log in.**

To log in just go to <https://outlook.office.com> (not www.outlook.office.com or any other address) and click on the log in button.

It will ask for your email address – which is on the paper we sent you. Please type it in carefully! Then click on the blue “next” or “continue” button and it will ask for your password. Type in the temporary password **for the first time only** and it will ask you to change the password once you click on the blue “next” or “continue” button.

It will ask you for the “Current Password” which is the temporary password and then ask for a new password and a confirmation of the new password.

New passwords must be a minimum of 8 characters long and must contain at least one capital letter and one number or special character (!"£\$%^&*())

Once both have been entered correctly it will log you into your inbox and you can start sending and receiving emails.

We realise that not all Council Grand Knights are technology wizards. If the Council Grand Knight does not have a computer, or feels unable to be able to log in, **it is the responsibility of that Council Grand Knight to appoint someone in the Council to take on the Grand Knight’s official email address.**



This will allow Head Office, The Board of Directors, Regional Directors, Provincial Grand Knights and Brothers to be able to communicate with your Council easily, irrespective of who is the Grand Knight.

We also appreciate that some Grand Knights will demit Office this year, so we have asked for this to be **passed on to the Grand Knight Elect instead to set up.**

We expect this to all be completed by **1st April 2024** so that we can start a new year in a better form of communication. If you are still having trouble, please do not hesitate to contact me. We will be running a Zoom Training Session for all Grand Knights on **Thursday 11th April 2024 at 7:30pm for any queries or questions. Head Office will send the Zoom codes to all Grand Knights on Monday 8nd April. Please look out for the email and join us.**

STOP HACKERS – To try and stop hackers (we cant stop them all) but to more show that emails are not from Members of the KSC, please ensure that all emails within the Order have the salutation “Dear Brother” and end with “Fraternally” or “In Fraternity”. Hackers don’t know this exists and is only within this Order. Also let Priests and Widows know that if they receive an email and it does not contain at least one of these then they should delete that email!!

We are currently reviewing the KSC Website on a quarterly basis to see where changes must or need to be made. We welcomed Brother John Kelly from Scotland to the Committee last month. 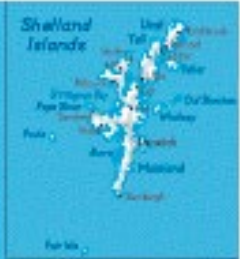

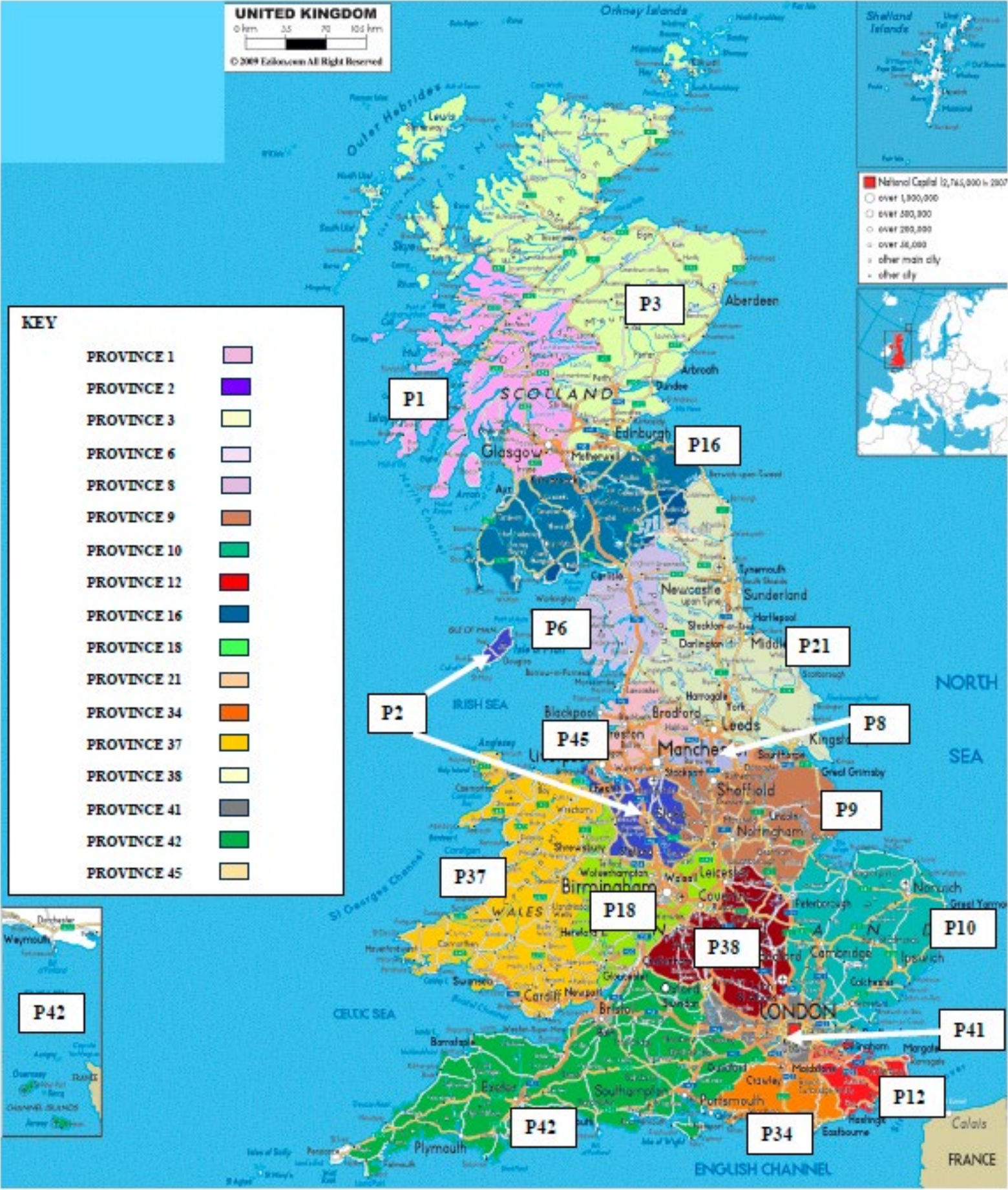
