## FINANCE

### 1. Financial Update

#### a. Head Office Dues 2024/25

A special thanks to all those Councils who paid their Head Office dues in December. There are still a number of Councils with unpaid dues and the sum outstanding was in the region of £15,000 at the end of December.

If your Council has still not paid their dues, please let Mairi know what your plan of action is as soon as possible.

#### b. Sale of Hillington property

We completed the sale of the Order's former Headquarters at Hillington in late November. We are currently in the process of calculating the Capital Gains Tax, resulting from this sale, which is due two months after completion of the sale. The balance remaining after payment of tax, as agreed at the Supreme Council in October, will be applied to reduce the loan the Order had taken out with the Central Benevolent Fund (CBF). The CBF is the fund where the Order's charitable monies are held.

#### c. Sale of Grand National draw tickets

This income remains a major resource to allow us to fund projects for our Youth and Action Projects. If we want to expand our profile this is a very easy way to generate income. The more tickets we sell the more money there is available for these projects. It is imperative that every effort is made to sell these tickets as quickly as possible and all Brothers should have received their tickets at this stage.

### 2. New Year Plan of Action

As we begin the New Year, I have to report that the Order is operating on a very tight financial rope.

The New Year brings new intentions, and I am hoping that we can achieve the following targets to help the Order's cash flow into a more secure position.

#### a) To get the Head Office Dues paid as early as possible

Sadly, we have had to write off some income in recent years as a result of the failure to collect Head Office Dues. Councils can too easily get into a cycle of not chasing up Head Office Dues and sadly by the time an effort is made to collect these arrears the Brother has left the Order, moved away or claimed hardship.

To avoid this cycle, I would be grateful if all Councils can:

- i. Agree the annual Council Dues in March 2025
- ii. Ensure that all Brothers are notified of the sum due in April 2025
- iii. Identify any Brother who is encountering any form of financial hardship and submit the form to the Supreme Director for Spirituality and Welfare in late April or May
- iv. Collect income from Brothers in May/June



### **b) To identify savings within our Budget**

It is hoped that Councils will do their very best in identifying savings in the 2025/26 financial year. As I stated in the December Bulletin, as an Order, we do not always allocate our resources in the best way possible and sadly sometimes we get it wrong. If you have any ideas on how we can improve matters please get in touch with me, a Board Director or a member of the Finance Committee at any time.

With developments like Artificial Intelligence, we need to reflect on how we can make the Order more efficient and viable. Change can be difficult for most of us but sometimes to survive we are required to change.

At the present time work is ongoing on updating the FA Forms on the Order's web page and it is intended that the new Forms will be available for use very soon.

### **c) To consider opportunities for generating additional income to the Order.**

In the December Bulletin I referred to the opportunity available to Brothers to make a legacy to the Order. This can be a tax efficient way of minimizing the amount of Inheritance Tax your family has to pay.

I am aware that a number of Brothers are extremely grateful to the Order and Council for helping them and their families in many ways and would like to consider this option. It is hoped to be able to make this option more easily available in the coming months. There are many other options available such as race nights and social events and Councils wherever possible should consider these.

## **3. Conclusion**

I would like to take this opportunity of wishing you and your family all the very best for the New Year.

## Development

Happy new year Brothers. Let us all make a new year's resolution to recruit and retain Brothers to help grow our Councils and live our Faith through Discipleship.

**New enquiries** - I am encouraged by the number of new brothers joining and the high level of web enquiries. We are averaging at least 8 web enquiries per month and I must stress the need to follow up all enquiries your PGK sends on to you ASAP.

**New Council** - On 1st December Clacton Council 124 was resurrected, with 9 Brothers, at Our Lady of Light at St Osyth (see photo below). It all started with a letter to the Parish Priest. Congratulations to all those involved in this initiative.



Each time we raise a new or resurrected Council I would like to see them being given a mentor to support them in their first few months. The mentor should ideally be the Grand Knight from a neighbouring Council.

**New Brothers** - Council 579 Bletchley & Milton Keynes in Province 38 Northampton initiated five new Brothers on 1st December. Welcome aboard Brothers.



**New initiative** - We have a marvellous opportunity to promote our Order to millions of Catholics via Being Catholic TV as we sponsor this site for a 4 month period. We hope to record some professional looking YouTube videos.





**Training** - The Development committee is reviewing and updating where necessary the Members' documents, literature, website page, etc to ensure it's all up to date. We will also announce a training workshop date soon, so please pencil in Saturday 8th February at 9am (TBC). My initial thought is to run this twice per year. Start of the year, and around May/June time as new M&D officers get bedded in.

**The Aylesford Pilgrimage** - This year it is on Sunday 29th June. Can I ask all Brothers in the Southern provinces to put this date in your diary. I hear it's a fantastic annual event where many Brothers join or get elevated within the Order.

**Annual induction/elevation event** - Could other Provinces perhaps consider hosting an annual event like Aylseford to induct/elevate Brothers in front of a large audience? Perhaps on the Feast of Saint Columba?

## Mission

### **Christmas Painting and Photography Competitions**

Full details of these competitions and the age ranges involved were given in the December 2024 Bulletin, and we hope that all our Provinces will have arranged entries. Please note especially the dates by which the winning entries from our Provinces are due to be at Head Office:-

- Photography competition winning entries (top two per age range) from Provinces by 3<sup>rd</sup> of January 2025;
- Christmas Painting winning entries (top three per age range) from Provinces by 31<sup>st</sup> of January 2025.

### **Pro-Life Issues**

As is well known by now, the Assisted Dying Bill debated in the House of Commons on Friday 29<sup>th</sup> of November did in fact receive its second reading, with 330 votes in favour and 275 against, with the majority of 55 in favour being significantly less than many in the media had predicted. The bill now has to go through Committee and Report stages for line by line scrutiny.

We wish to thank all the brothers of the Order and their family members who wrote to their MPs prior to the 29<sup>th</sup> of November debate.

Bishop Sherrington asks that we pray that our MPs will have the wisdom to reject the bill at a later stage in its progress, and we need to keep up our contacts with our local MPs as the bill proceeds through its Committee and Report stages.

The Alma Mater Project as our new National Action Project is well under way, and we need our Councils to have at least one fundraising endeavour each year for the project. As an example, with around 200 Councils and assuming 150 reasonably active ones, an average surplus of £200 on these events could get the project £30,000 a year. Even at our current numbers that should be a reasonable target.

The Alma Mater Fund is an initiative of SPUC that provides financial grants to pregnant students facing difficulties at universities across the UK in order to support them in pursuing their academic and personal goals. Through the work of the initiative the Alma Mater fund coordinator can also direct students to further sources of support and advice.

Publicity materials to assist Councils with this project will be available in the New Year.



### **Surplus from the Grand National Draw**

This enables the Order to fund projects for Youth and Action, so it is imperative that Councils sell these enthusiastically – **and not just to our own Members**. We all contribute to other charities' raffles, so there is no reason why we shouldn't be doing likewise with our own draw? We should remember that there is no funding for these activities assumed in the calculation of Members' Dues to Head Office.

Provincial and Council Grand Knights are asked to ensure that this need is given a high priority in all our Councils. The cash and counterfoils for the draw need returning to Head Office by Wednesday 19<sup>th</sup> of March 2025.

### **Catholic Social Teaching**

A development for 2025 is to have a focus on Catholic Social Teaching and the Corporal Works of Mercy. We have a topic for each month, January 2025's being Embracing Human Dignity, with the Corporal Work of Mercy being Feed the Hungry. The detail for this will be issued to Councils as a separate email, and Councils are asked to set aside some time in each of your Council Meetings for these topics.

### **The Order's Emergency Relief Fund**

This used to be one of the Order's crowning glories, and I wish to see it reinstated as something to which Councils are asked to contribute some of our fundraising efforts. In the past, our Councils have been very generous in supporting this cause, and receiving regular contributions to this fund enables the Order to respond speedily with initial donations to causes and areas in need of emergency relief.

### **Support for Vocations**

This is one of our key objectives as an Order, but it is by no means clear how many of our Provinces and Councils are actively pursuing this as a key objective; so we need our Council and Provincial Grand Knights and Action Convenors to let us know about your endeavours and successful promotional events, and to publicise these.

### **A Challenge for 2025**

Would Councils please set out to undertake a new activity and challenge in 2025 as your Council's New Year's resolution, as a means of rejuvenating yourselves, and hopefully being a means of attracting new Members to your Councils.

Wishing all Brothers and your families a happy New Year, and a successful year in your work for the Order in 2025.
