





Interactive online Advent calendar 2024

"Do No Harm" is a short documentary which highlights some of the grave concerns around proposals to legalise assisted dying in the UK and Scottish Parliaments.

The documentary, which features Cardinal Vincent Nichols, Bishop John Keenan, Dr Gillian Wright, Lord David Alton, and Professor David Albert Jones, gathers together experts from the medical and palliative care professions, alongside prominent politicians, ethics experts and religious leaders, to construct a unified voice of unease.

It spotlights key concerns around preserving human dignity and protections for vulnerable groups, and challenges the robustness of tabled safeguards in the UK legislation, by citing the experience of other jurisdictions which quickly eased access and expanded eligibility.

"Reverse Advent Calendar" – A KSC Action Project with Caritas Southwark

If you are not familiar with the concept it involves the gifting of a single food or toiletry item each day from the 1st of December up until Christmas and then that box of gifts being given to a local charity, or food bank. Dates of gifting may need tweaking depending on the charity or food bank so it may finish on the 20th or 22nd for instance.

It can be rolled out in a number of ways, each Brother and their families taking part, involving your schools, or going to the parishioners and asking them to take part (advertising in the newsletter, giving out flyers/instructions & setting up a donation point). In all cases, however, liaise with your local food bank and arrange pickup from your Parishes and drop off for the gift boxes to the charity. You may also consider going to supermarkets and collecting empty boxes and providing them to participants. It's a simple concept but needs some effort to make it work.



November For anyone who has lost a child We pray that all parents who mourn the loss of a son or daughter find support in their community and receive peace and consolation from the Holy Spirit.

December For pilgrims of hope We pray that this Jubilee Year strengthen our faith, helping us to recognize the Risen Christ in our daily lives, and that it may transform us into pilgrims of Christian hope
