Pope Francis marks 650th

anniversary of revelations of

Mother Julian of Norwich

Pope Francis sends a message to Catholic and Anglican pilgrims who are commemorating the 650th anniversary of the Shewings, or Revelations of the Passion of Christ, of Mother Julian of Norwich.

Pope Francis sent a message to pilgrims from across the world who throughout the year are gathering in the Catholic and Anglican cathedrals of the English city of Norwich to mark the 650th anniversary of the Shewings of Mother Julian of Norwich.

The Pope assured pilgrims of his spiritual closeness to those taking part in the various ecumenical celebrations.

Julian of Norwich was an English anchoress of the Middle Ages who received a series of visions or "shewings" of the Passion of Christ in 1373. Her writings on the subject, now known as the Revelations of Divine Love, are thought to be the earliest surviving English-language works by a women.

The significance of this English mystic

In his message, Pope Francis said, "the profound significance of this English mystic for the Christian tradition speaks to us from across the centuries and is increasingly being acknowledged and celebrated."

Indeed, he added, "her maternal influence, humble anonymity, and profound theological insights stand as timely reminders that faith in God's loving providence and holiness of life expressed in generous service to our brothers and sisters in need, are timeless truths underpinning not only the life of Christian discipleship but the very fabric of a just and fraternal society."

Pope Francis went on to stress that of particular note is Julian's generosity in welcoming those who sought spiritual counsel and encouragement.

He explained that "this willingness to sacrifice self-convenience for the sake of others is especially needed in responding to the endemic problems of isolation and loneliness felt by so many in the more materially affluent nations of the world."

Relevance today

Bringing his message to a close, Pope Francis noted how Mother Julian's message of God's mercy and compassion continues to be vital for today's world.

In her Revelations of Divine Love, we learn that she was taught through God's grace that, despite the presence of evil in our midst, "all manner of thing shall be well."

In this regard, the Pope concluded, "I pray that all who face the pressing challenges of war, injustice, ecological disaster or spiritual poverty, may be consoled and strengthened by these enduring words of wisdom."

Finally, as is customary, the Holy Father imparted his Blessing to all those participating in the commemorative events.

Arundel Cathedral celebrates its 150th anniversary on 1 July, with a range of events planned to mark this historic occasion.

The anniversary weekend will be commemorated by the celebration of Vespers and Mass attended by representatives from Diocesan Parishes and Schools. Dignitaries including Catholic Bishops from across England and Wales, the High Sheriffs of East and West Sussex and the Lord Lieutenant.

Guildford Council 551
















Council 324 also submitted an entry to the Prayer Competition. Being the only entry it was selected as the Provincial winner and forwarded to Head Office.

Brother Sylvester Vincent Hooke Hastings and Rother Valley Council 630 Died 9th March 2023 Aged 91 R.I.P.

Sylvester Vincent Hooke "Paddy"

On the 18th April we celebrated the Requiem Mass for our founder member and first Grand Knight for Council 630 at St Mary Star of the Sea Church Hastings. The celebrant was Fr Tony Harris SAC In addition to our Council members Bro Geoff Breeze travelled from Chichester to pay his respects to his friend and his first Provincial Deputy. Also in attendance was Bro Bob Waters a long time fellow Provincial Officer.

As is our custom on these occasions Council 630 members honoured Paddy with a Guard of Honour on entry and on exiting the church. Last year when Paddy was still sufficiently mobile, we celebrated his 90th Birthday with a Mass for his intentions followed by a reception in the Parish Hall. Paddy was touched by receiving a Papal Blessing, deserved by his longstanding devotion to his work within the Parish. It was a joyful fun filled day.

Angela, Paddy's daughter had cared for him lovingly for the past six years. The last months of his life were particularly difficult as he had a number of serious falls. Paddy never complained, taking all his difficulties with quiet resignation and a typical humorous remark. Each Wednesday he was accompanied in his wheelchair by his family friend Eileen for the highlight of his week Mass at St Mary Star of the Sea.

Paddy was one of nature's gentlemen who lived his Catholic Faith to the full. He was generous with his time and when Chancellor would make sure that brothers in need and widows were visited and helped in a practical way. Paddy and his wife Sylvia loved praying the Rosary and for many years had a monthly Rosary Prayer Group in their home. Paddy supported Sylvia's tremendous fund raising for St Michael's Hospice.

He was greatly loved by his family described as a "Fantastic Dad" by his daughter. Paddy had a very successful career in the Prison Service and was the Chief Prison Officer at Wormwood Scrubs

He is missed by family and friends at Star of the Sea and by our Council members.

Bro Roy Worsley was born in Manchester in 1929. He did his National Service with the RAF and trained as an engineer.

He and his wife Marjorie married in 1951. They emigrated to South Africa in 1985 and there he joined the Knights of Da Gama. This was in the Apartheid era and Roy always kept the prayer to end Apartheid with his KSC prayer cards.

When he returned to England he moved to Farnborough and in 1989 joined the KSC Council no 185 there. He moved to Eastbourne and transferred to Council 433 in 1999.

He was excellent at DIY and continued to make major alterations to his house in Pevensey Bay until ill health forced him to move to a care home in 2022. Marjorie, his wife, died in 2012 and so could not continue to tell him to finish one job before starting another!

Brother Roy Worsley Eastbourne Council 433 Died 29th April 2023 Aged 94 R.I.P. He was Grand Knight of Eastbourne Council from 2001 to 2003 and then became Treasurer of the Council, a position he held until 2022 when he moved into a care home.

He had 4 daughters, one lived in the USA and he enjoyed his regular visits to see her there, travelling all over that country. One daughter said he

seemed to spend much time in the care home playing Rummikub with 3 ladies! These ladies, in wheelchairs, all attended the funeral.

Bro Roy died in Eastbourne on 29 April 2023 following a stroke, about 4 weeks after his 94th birthday. His funeral was held on 19 May 2023 at the church of Christ the King, Langney. May he Rest in Peace.

Why is it important to take care of your emails?

You must take care of your emails and in particular your email password.

If somebody is able to access your emails they can take over your account and prevent you getting access yourself. They then send spoof emails to those on your contacts to try and trick them into passing on information such as their email password. I would not do this, I hear you say. Unfortunately it is all too easy to get caught.

There are many ways that somebody can look at your emails and then send you a phishing email to gain more information.

One email that is circulating and which could come to you, is a copy of your 'genuine' notice from your provider telling you that your bill is ready to view. You need to check where the email came from before you do anything else. Check to see if the sending email address is your provider. If it is not just delete it.

"CLICK HERE TO VIEW BILL" appears in a box to tempt you to look. You are then provided with a form to complete your email address and password to get into your account and see your bill, fair enough you think, this is normal, but beware. If you give that information you are caught. You may give access to your email account. More importantly if you use that password for any other account or website you have given access to those accounts also. (You should not use the same password for more than one site).

I mention this now because a number of brothers have had their emails compromised recently.

One of the things that happens which you will notice is that you get calls from friends or brothers saying they have received strange emails from you. Because you have been locked out of your account you cannot see these but at least know that you will have to contact your provider to change your password.

The real problem arises if you have used that password for other sites. If these are banking sites you are in real trouble and must contact all those sites as quickly as possible to change your password or to advise them, or if that is the case, and monies are missing, that you have been defrauded.

Hackers get their information from a number of sources but if they have access to your email account they also have access to your contacts. That is why they send emails to them which others think you sent.

They can of course easily get a package of emails they know are connected to you without even accessing your account, namely when you send a circular email showing the email addresses of all recipients. Beware of this also because if you have not sent the copies **Bcc** you could be in breach of the Data Protection Regulations and subject to a hefty fine. Ask yourself, have your recipients given you their consent to reveal their email address to others?

Once hackers know that they have a valid email address they will try to trick that person to pay monies or they will send them the sort of phishing email mentioned above to get personal details or passwords.

Do not open suspicious emails; look at them under preview only and then forward them to the governments Cyber Security Centre before deleting them completely.

The best way to deal with any suspicious emails is to forward them on to the Government's site the National Cyber Security Centre report@phishing.gov.uk

Above all make sure that all your passwords are really strong and individual, and that is especially true for email accounts. Do not use the same password for more than one site.
