# **Provincial Grand Knight**

I attended the Supreme Council 24 in Liverpool. Now that we have a new Supreme Knight, Finance Director, Board of Directors, CBF Trustees and revised Constitution and Rules, it is hoped that there is renewed sense of stability moving forward and a more positive future for our Order.

Membership is still very much in the spotlight and to date we have had a disappointing lack of response from the two suggested areas, Horsham and Haywards Heath. I have now suggested to them that we make an address to the respective congregations, with their permissions, in the New Year. I will be speaking to the Bishop and updating him on the situation so far.

Council 277 Brighton Council have acknowledged that they have a serious problem, having not met for 4 years and Bro Paul soon to step down as GK due to disability. Arrangements are being made to meet and discuss the restructuring of Council 277.

I received a request from the Diocese Director of Catholic Education, together with Bishop Richard, for possible financial assistance in obtaining new Lectionaries for the Schools within the Diocese. I am aware that several hundred pounds has already been raised, and I would urge all Councils to do what they can to contribute to this appeal. A slip has been put into each book, at the request of Bishop Richard, advising that the purchase of the books was made possible by the support of the Diocese and the Knights of St Columba.

Brothers, it was disappointing to note that only 5 Brothers attended the Mass for St Philip Howard. Some of us are working hard at raising our profile within the diocese and this is being undermined by the apathy of others. These Masses should be better attended for the sake of the Order.

The new National Action Project for 24-26 is the Alma Mater Fund. More details will follow.

I would like to thank all Provincial Officers, all GKs and Council members for their continuing work in promoting and supporting our Order.

## Welfare

This has been a relatively quiet time for me since I took over as Provincial Officer for Welfare and Spirituality at the end of May this year. The main events were St Philip Howard Pilgrimage at Arundel Cathedral on Sunday 20<sup>th</sup> October and the Mass for our deceased Brothers on Sunday 17th November.

The attendance at the St Philip Howard Mass by the Knights was abysmal and disappointing. Surely for a pilgrimage founded by the Knights in the late 1960's, the attendance can be much better than just five brothers? Bishop Richard has offered to help us recruit in the various parishes. He is supporting us so in return we should support him. We can hardly expect to receive his help if we can't be bothered to turn up at various events. Bishop Richard said Mass for us on 17th November. He is supporting us. Let us show our appreciation and support him.

The Mass for our deceased Brothers was much better attended with around 25 Brothers present so well done for that. It was a bit embarrassing for me as I was struck down with a stomach virus and was unable to attend. My thanks to our PGK, Brother Tony and also Brother Charles for covering for me.

On Saturday 2<sup>nd</sup> November a meeting was held on MS Teams to discuss the various forms relating to the Order's Finance and Welfare. It was for all GKs /Finance Officers/Welfare Officers. It was a very useful meeting which was recorded. The link is available from Brother Bertie Grogan for those who were unable to attend the meeting.

A new edition of the Lectionary, the book which contains the readings which are proclaimed at Mass, comes into use in England and Wales on the First Sunday of Advent (the day of our meeting). The new edition uses the English Standard Version-Catholic Edition for the readings and the Abbey Psalms and Canticles for the Responsorial Psalms. This is a new publication of the Lectionary using a different scripture translation which means that although the content remains the same for each Sunday/weekday, the wording will be slightly different.

There will be provision for Saints who have been added to the Universal Calendar since the last Lectionary published in 1981. There will also be the readings for the National Calendars. In addition, some of the revised liturgical rites, such as Marriage, have additional readings. It is normal practice in the Roman Rite that there is only a single edition of a liturgical text in use in a particular country. Therefore, in the same way as only the third edition of the Roman Missal (2010) may be used in the celebration of Mass (in the Ordinary Form); the same will be true for the Lectionary. The current Lectionary (1981) is in three volumes. One significant change in the layout is that all the readings will be given in sense lines as an assistance to the reader. This is recommended in the Introduction to the Lectionary and is common to most recent publications of the Lectionary. The effect is that readings do require more space and this means more pages. The new Lectionary is in four volumes: one for Sundays and Solemnities, two volumes for Weekdays and the Proper of Saints, a final volume with Ritual Masses, Masses for the Dead etc.

The Archdiocese of St Andrew's and Edinburgh have published three YouTube videos on the Lectionary which are useful for information as to why the text has changed. The three videos are:

# **ACTION**

#### **New Lectionaries For Schools of The Diocese**

Following Bishop Richard's suggestion that the KSC support the purchase of the Chapel Version of the new lectionaries for our schools, I wrote to all GK's of Province 34 asking them to consider how they would respond.

The Bishop's request came to me in mid-September, via Brother Tony, PGK from Ms Julie Oldroyd, Director of The A&B Diocese Education Service.

I explained to Ms Oldroyd that time was too short to provide money before the purchase date of November 1<sup>st</sup>, the lectionaries being needed for the start of Advent. Our best answer would be for Councils to arrange fund raising activities in 2025 and thereby provide as much support as they can. I have received positive responses from Bognor and Worthing Councils.

Ms Oldroyd later asked me to commit to providing support which I did and she undertook to ensure that the Knights of St Columba will be included in the list of those who contribute to the purchase which will be included in each book.

An order for 18 set has been placed with CTS, for our schools at a cost of £6,399 which includes a discount of 10%. This equates to £355 per set, so I ask Councils to aim to fund at least one set and maybe more for those Councils who enjoy good support from their parishioners in their fundraising activities. Like Worthing Council, could you make the Lectionaries the target for your local fund raising for 2025?

During his spiritual address, Deacon Mark Woods, Chaplain to Worthing Council, described the New Lectionary for England Wales and Scotland which will come into use on the First Sunday in Advent 2024. Scripture readings will use the English Standard Version.

It will come in 4 Volumes.

Volume1: Sundays, Solemnities of the Lord.

Volume 2: Weekdays, Advent, Christmas, Ordinary Time, Lent, Easter and Proper of the Saints.

Volume 3: Weekday Ordinary Time, Proper of Saints.

Volume 4: Ritual Masses, Masses for various means and Occasions, Masses for the Dead.

The New Lectionary is part of a continuing process of revising liturgical translations to provide a unified response to the Diocese. Councils should submit funds raised to our Provincial Treasurer, which will also allow a fair record to be kept and a single sum to be donated from the Province.
